ZANZIBAR CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) FOR MAY 2021

ANNUAL HEADLINE INFLATION RATE RECORDED 0.8 PERCENT

Zanzibar Annual Headline Inflation rate for the year ending May 2021 decreased to 0.8 percent compare to 1.9 percent for the year ended April 2021. Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate decreased to 0.5 percent in May 2021 from 1.7 percent recorded in April 2021. The overall Index increased to 117.7 in May 2021 compared to 116.7 recorded in May 2020 (**Table 1**).

ANNUAL FOOD AND NON-FOOD INFLATION RATES

Annual Inflation Rate for food decreased to 0.5 percent for the year ending May 2021 compared to 1.7 percent recorded for the year ended April 2021. The overall index for food increased to 119.8 in May 2021 compared to 119.2 recorded in May 2020, while overall index for non-food increased to 116.1 in May 2021 compared to 114.9 in May 2020. Annual inflation rate for non-food decreased to 1.0 percent in May 2021 compared to 2.0 percent in April 2021 (**Table 2**). Products contribute to decrease for Annual inflation rate were Mbeya Rice (12.4%), Maize flour (16.4%), Green Cooking Banana (13.3%) and Cement (14.9%) (**Table 3**).

MONTHLY HEADLINE INFLATION RATE INCREASE TO 1.1 PERCENT IN MAY 2021

During May 2021 the monthly headline inflation rate increased to 1.1 percent, compared to 0.9 percent recorded for the month ended April 2021. The monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate for the month ending May 2021 is 2.3 percent compared to 1.1 percent for the month ended April 2021 (**Table 1**). The products that contribute to increase monthly inflation rate are Mbeya Rice (1.7%), Fish Items (7.7%) Yellow Cooking Bananas (19.1%), Kerosene (5.1%), Petrol (1.4%) and Diesel (1.1%). Explanatory Note

The CPI measures the average percentage changes over time (between two time periods) in the prices of a "basket" of consumer goods and services acquired by households (the market basket) in Zanzibar. The Zanzibar CPI covers prices of 343 items collected in 641 outlets in Unguja and Pemba urban Centers. The goods and services included in the ZCPI basket are classified according to the UN COICOP (Classification of Individual Consumption According by Purpose) with 12 divisions.

Months

The ZCPI weights are based on both monetary and non-momentary expenditures relating to consumption for households in Zanzibar for the 2014/15 Household Budget Survey (HBS). The weight is based on expenditures of both urban and rural households. Both base price and index has reference period of January 2017.

The computation of indices at elementary level based on geometric mean of the price relative while at higher level the Laspeyres formula was to compute the aggregate indices.
