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ZANZIBAR CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) FOR JANUARY, 2018

ANNUAL HEADLINE INFLATION RATE DECREASED TO 5.2 PERCENT

Zanzibar Annual Headline Inflation rate for the year ending January 2018 decreased to 5.2 percent compared to the 5.9 percent recorded during the year ended December 2017. Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate decreased to 1.8 percent for the year ending January 2018 compared to the 6.2 percent recorded during the year ended December 2017. The overall Index increased to 105.2 in January 2018 compared to the 100.0 recorded in January 2017 (**Table 1**).

ANNUAL FOOD AND NON FOOD INFLATION RATES

Annual Inflation Rate for food decreased to 1.7 percent for the year ending January 2018 compared to the 6.4 percent recorded for the year ended December 2017. The overall index for food increased to 101.7 in January 2018 compared to the 100.0 in January 2017, while overall index for non-food increased to 107.7 in January 2018 compared to the 100.0 in January 2017. Annual inflation rate for non-food increased to 7.7 percent in January 2018 compared to the 5.5 percent in December 2017 (**Table 2**). Products contribute to decrease for Annual inflation rate were Maize Flour (10.2%), Green Cooking Banana (13.0%), Yellow Cooking Banana (6.8%), Sugar (3.2%) and Cement (7.5%). (Table 3)

MONTHLY HEADLINE INFLATION RATE DECREASED TO 0.1 PERCENT IN JANUARY, 2018


During January 2018 the monthly headline inflation rate decreased to 0.1 percent compared to 1.6 percent recorded in December 2017. The monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate for the year ending January 2018 were negative 2.4 percent compared to 2.8 for the year ended December 2017 (Table 1). The decreases of monthly inflation rate was due to decrease of prices of items such as Maize Flour (0.8%), Coconut (18.8%), Irish Potatoes (0.9%), Cassava (8.1%), Charcoal (2.8%), Fish (2.3%) and Green Cooking Bananas (15.6%). Explanatory Note

The CPI measures the average percentage changes over time (between two time periods) in the prices of a "basket" of consumer goods and services acquired by households (the market basket) in Zanzibar. The Zanzibar CPI covers prices of 343 products collected in 641 outlets in Unguja and Pemba urban Centers. The goods and services included in the ZCPI basket are classified according to the UN COICOP (Classification of Individual Consumption According by Purpose) with 12 divisions.

The ZCPI weights are based on both monetary and non-momentary expenditures relating to consumption for households in Zanzibar for the 2014/15 Household Budget Survey (HBS). The weight is based on expenditures of both urban and rural households. Both base price and index has reference period of January 2017.

The computation of indices at elementary level based on geometric mean of the price relative while at higher level the Laspeyres formula was to compute the aggregate indices.
