EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A total of 22,844 offence cases were reported in 2023. Mjini district the highest number of offence (6,874 cases) in 2023. Offences against property reported highest (9,345 cases).

A total of 38,791 traffic cases were reported in 2023. Majority of cases were minor cases (38,598 cases). The number of traffic cases increased by 72.0 percent from 22,547 traffic reported cases in 2022 to 38,791 traffic reported cases in 2023.

The number of criminal cases reported in 2023 was 3,041 of which 1,020 cases (33.5 percent) were disposed and 2,021 (66.5 percent) were continuing means that either pending in court or under investigation.

Offences against property stolen was 8,400 cases, which cause the loss of TZS 9,770,599,374. The value of recovered property was TZS 779,240,100, equivalent to 8.0 percent of the total loss value. Mjini district reported highest number of offences against properties stolen accounted to 2,797 which is worth TZS 3,024,843,300 and TZS 256,015,000 value of recovered property.

Cases filed in high court for year 2023 was 83 where by 13 cases were decided. Drugs trafficking cases records the highest number accounted 58 cases. The number of filed cases decreased from 145 in 2022 to 83 in 2023.

Regional Magistrate Courts filed cases in 2023 was 1,139 cases, Mjini Magharibi region leading by having 624 cases. The highest offence recorded were rape (203 cases). About 54.3 percent (618 cases) of the filed cases were decided and 45.7 percent (521 cases) were pending before the court. Criminal cases filed at the Juvenile court in 2023 was 121 cases.

Criminal cases filed at District Magistrate Courts in 2023 was 891, of which 546 were decided. The number of civil cases filed in District courts in 2023 was 49, with 14 decided

cases.

Criminal filed in Primary Magistrate Courts in 2023 was 1,976, there were 1,910 decided cases and 66 cases were pending before the court. Civil cases in Primary Magistrate Courts in 2023 was 481.

The overall crime rate in 2023 was 212 crimes per 100,000 populations. Region with a highest crime rate was Kusini Unguja with 250 crimes per 100,000 populations.

Kadhi's courts in 2023 filed 1,534 Divorce cases, of which 966 were decided and 568 were pending before the court. Civil cases on Islamic law of succession filed 694 cases in 2023.

The total number of inmates in 2023 was 520, out of which 510 were male and 10 were female. Majority observed in aged 18 – 35 with 363 inmates. Most of the inmates 197 served three months and below. The total number of juvenile inmates in 2023 was 12 all were boys.

The total number of remands in 2023 was 1,224, of which 1,201 were males and 23 were females. The larger number of remands (865) aged between 18-35. The total number of juvenile remands in 2023 was 18 all were boys.

The inmates who were participated in vocational training was 508 whereby 501 were males and seven (7) were females. Most of inmates participated in Construction (118 inmates).

CHAPTER ONE: INTRODUCTION

1.1 Introduction

Crime and Civil statistics attempt to provide statistical measures of crimes in the society. Given that crime is usually secretive by nature, its measurements are difficult. Several methods are used for capturing crime and civil statistics including household surveys, hospital and insurance records and others.

Crime and Civil statistics report compiled data from enforcement agencies; the main institutions for data are Police, Judiciary and Institute of Education for Offenders.

Crime rate is a useful statistical indicator for many purposes, such as evaluating the effectiveness of crime prevention measures or the relative safety of a particular city or place. Crime rate statistics are commonly used to advocate for or against a policy designed to deal with crime.

The main sources of the information's in Judiciary are:-

- High Court of Zanzibar
- Regional Magistrate Court
- District Magistrate Court
- Primary Magistrate Court
- Kadhi's Court

The main source of the information's in Police Headquarter are:-

- Regional Police Post
- District Police Post

The main source of the information's in and Institute of Education for Offenders are:-

- Central Correctional Facility
- Zonal Correctional Facility

1.3 Concept and Definition of the Terms

Assault means physical attack against the body of another person resulting in serious injury, excluding indecent/sexual, threats and slapping/punching 'Assault' leading to death should also be excluded.

Burglary means gaining unauthorized access to a part of building/dwelling or other premises, including by use of force, with the intent to steal goods (breaking and entering). "Burglary" should include, where possible, theft from a house, apartment or other dwelling place, factory, shop or office, from a military establishment, or by using false keys. It should exclude theft from a car, from a container, from a vending machine, from a parking meter and from a fenced meadow/compound.

Car theft means the removal of a Motor Vehicle without the consent of the owner, excluding motorcycles, commercial buses, Lorries, construction and agricultural vehicles.

Correctional facility means a public building used for the confinement of people convicted of serious crimes. In law, Correctional facility means any prison, penitentiary, penal facility, jail, detention unit, or other facility in which persons are incarcerated by government and corrections program are provided.

Crime Rate means the number of criminal cases divided by population per hundred thousand

Cultural Property means property which, on religious or secular grounds, is considered as being of importance for archaeology, prehistory, history, literature, art or science and which belongs to one of the following categories: Rare collections of fauna, flora, minerals and anatomy and objects of paleontological interest, property relating to history, products of archaeological excavations, antiquities, property of artistic interest, rare manuscripts and old books, documents and publications, archives, old musical instruments, and articles of furniture more than one hundred years old.

Domestic burglary/housebreaking means theft from a house, apartment or other dwelling place.

Drug-Related Crimes means all intentional acts that involve the cultivation, production, manufacture, extraction, preparation, offering for sale, distribution, purchase, and sale, delivery on any terms whatsoever, brokerage, dispatch, transit dispatch, transport,

importation, exportation, and possession or trafficking of internationally controlled drugs.

Drug Possession/Use means drug offences related to drug use or possession for use.

Drug Trafficking means drug offences, which are not in connection with personal use **Identified Victims of Trafficking in Persons** means persons identified as having been recruited transported, transferred, harbored or received for the purposes of exploitation in accordance with the above definition of Trafficking in Persons.

Illicit Trafficking in Cultural Property means the illicit import, export or transfer of ownership of Cultural Property.

Imprisonment means a custodial sentence incurred for an offence, the act of confining someone in a prison. In law, Imprisonment the act of putting somebody in prison or in another place from which they cannot escape.

Inmate, means person under convicted

Kidnapping means unlawfully detaining a person or persons against their will (including through the use of force, threat, fraud or enticement) for the purpose of demanding for their liberation an illicit gain or any other economic gain or other material benefit, or in order to obligesomeone to do or not to do something. Kidnapping" excludes disputes over child custody.

Motor Vehicle theft means the removal of a motor vehicle without the consent of the owner of the vehicle. 'Motor Vehicle' includes all land vehicle with an engine that run on the road, including cars, motorcycles, buses, construction and agricultural vehicles.

Offender means a person convicted of committing a crime after reaching the legal procedures. In prison, law is a someone who has violated a criminal or moral law:

Persons Brought before the Criminal Courts means persons brought before any legal body authorized to pronounce a conviction under national criminal law, whether the person is finally acquitted or convicted.

Persons Convicted means persons found guilty by any legal body authorized to pronounce a conviction under national criminal law, whether or not the conviction was later upheld. The total number of persons convicted should include persons convicted of serious special law offences but excludes persons convicted of minor road traffic offences and other petty offences.

Prison means an institution for the confinement of persons who have been remanded (held) in custody by a judicial authority or who have been deprived of their liberty following conviction for a crime to be punished. *The act of detaining people in legal custody*

Prisons, Penal Institutions or Correctional Institutions or Rehabilitation Center means all public institutions where persons are deprived of their liberty. The institutions may include, but are not limited to, penal, correctional, and psychiatric facilities under the prison administration."

Rape means sexual intercourse without valid consent.

Rehabilitation means the process of re-educating and preparing those who have committed a crime, to re-enter society as a law-abiding citizen. In law is using rehabilitative measures rather than punishment to address criminals in the prison system. The goal is to address all of the underlying root causes of crime in order to ensure inmates will be able to live a crime-free lifestyle once they are released from prison.

Remand, means person who waiting to be sentenced (pronounced judgment on)

Robbery means theft of property from a person, overcoming by forces or threat of force. Where possible the category "robbery" should include muggings (bag snatching) and theft with violence, but should exclude pocketing and extortion.

Sentence means a prison time ordered after conviction, a sentence includes all fines, community service, restitution or other punishment, or terms of probation. In law, a sentence is the punishment for a crime ordered by a trial court after conviction in a criminal procedure, normally at the conclusion of a trial.

Sexual violence means rape and sexual assault, including sexual offences against children.

Sexual offences against children means natural sexual crimes committed against minors of age.

Theft means depriving a person or organization of property without force with the intent to keep it. This excludes Burglary, housebreaking, Robbery, and theft of a motor vehicle, which are recorded separately.

Trafficking in Persons means the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or receipt of persons, by means of threat or use of force or other forms of coercion, of

abduction, of fraud, of deception, of abuse of power or position of vulnerability or of giving or receiving payments or benefits to achieve the consent of a person having control over another person, for the purpose of exploitation. Reference may be made to the provisions of the Protocol to prevent, suppress, and punish trafficking in persons, supplementing the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime. Data on smuggling of migrants should be excluded.

CHAPTER TWO: OFFENCES

2.1 Introduction

This chapter presents the information on offences statistics for 2023. It covers the offences reported such as traffic cases, offences against persons, property and tranquility in Zanzibar. In addition the chapter entail data collected from 2019-2023.

2.2 Offences

A total of 22,844 offences were reported in 2023 with higher proportion of minor cases (19,779 of the total cases) than serious cases (3,065 cases). District wise, the highest number of offences occurred in Mjini with 6,874 offences, which is equivalent to 30.1 percent of the total offences followed by Magharibi "A" with 5,027 offences (22.0 percent). The least number of cases was reported in Micheweni district with 238 offences equivalent to 1.0 percent of the total offences reported.

The number of offences increased from 12,258 in 2022 to 22,844 in 2023 whereby serious cases decreased by 4.0 percent from 3,192 cases in 2022 to 3,065 cases in 2023 and minor cases increased by 1.2 from 9,066 cases to 19,779 cases at the same period.

2.3 Traffic Cases

A total of 38,791 traffic cases were reported in 2023 with higher proportion of minor cases (38,598 of the total cases) than serious cases (193). District wise, the highest number of traffic cases observed in Kati with 7,780 cases (20.1 percent of the total cases) followed by Magharibi "B" with 5,314 cases (13.7 percent).

The least number of cases reported in Micheweni district with 484 cases equivalent to 1.2 percent of the total cases reported. For serious cases, the leading districts are Magharibi "A" and Kati districts accounted for 32 and 31 cases, respectively.

The total number of cases increased by 72.0 percent from 22,547 traffic cases in 2022 to 38,791 traffic cases in 2023 whereby serious cases increased by 12.0 percent from 172 to 193 cases while minor cases increased by 73.0 percent from 22,375 to 38,598 cases at the same period.

2.4 Offences against Persons


The data show that the total number of offences against persons reported was 2,049. The offences, which occurred frequently in 2023, were rape to girls and Assault. Rape to girls recorded the highest number (824 offences) which accounted for 40.2 percent of all offences reported followed by Assault accounted 376 cases (18.4 percent).

The number of offences against persons in 2023 increased to 2,049 offences from 1,421 offences in 2022 (31.6 percent). Rape to girls offences increased by 40.9 percent from 585 offences recorded in 2022 to 824 offences in 2023. Assault increased by 20.1 percent from 125 in 2022 to 376 offences in 2023 (Table 2.3 and Figure 2.1).

2.5 Offences against Property


The data show that, the total number of offences against property reported was 9,345 in 2023. Theft recorded the highest number of 7,075 offences, which accounted for 75.7 percent of all offences reported followed by Breaking and Burglary with 833 offences (8.9 percent) and Theft of motor cycle with 334 offences (3.6 percent).

Theft offences increased to 7,075 offences in 2023 compared to 344 offences recorded in 2022. Breaking and Burglary increased by 9.9 percent from 758 offences in 2022 to 833 offences in 2023, followed by Theft of motor cycle, which increased by 86.6 percent from 179 offences in 2022 to 334 offences in 2023.

2.6 Offences against Tranquility

A total number of offences against tranquility reported was 92 in 2023. Unlawful possession of Local Liquor offence recorded the highest number of 54 offences, which accounted for 58.7 percent of all offences reported, followed by Trading without License with 23 offences (25.0 percent).

The number of offences against tranquility in 2023 decreased by 72.4 percent compared with that of previous year. Unlawful possession of Local Liquor also decreased by 21.7 percent from 69 offences in 2022 to 54 offences 2023. Trading without License increased to 23 offences in 2023 from 0 offences recorded in 2022 (Table 2.5).

2.7 Trend of Cases

The number of criminal cases reported in 2023 was 3,041 of which 1,020 cases (33.5 percent) were disposed and 2,021 (66.5 percent) were continuing means that either pending in court or under investigation. Only 3.2 percent of all cases had been disposed as convicted cases and 26.3 percent were closed. Majority of the cases (56.7 percent) are still under investigation. The number of criminal cases decreased by 4.8 percent from 3,194 cases in 2022 to 3,041 in 2023, (Table 2.6).

2.8 (a). Property Stolen and Recovered

The total offences against property stolen in 2023 was 8,400 cases, which cause the loss of TZS 9,770,599,374. The value of recovered property was TZS 779,240,100, equivalent to 8.0 percent of the total loss value.

In 2023, Mjini district reported highest number of offences against properties stolen accounted to 2,797 (33.3 percent) which is worth TZS 3,024,843,300 and TZS 256,015,000 value of recovered property. Mkoani district has lowest with 95 cases (1.1 percent) which is worth TZS 33,224,000 and 7,604,000 value of recovered property. The total number of offences against property stolen and recovered in 2023 increased compared to 2022 (Table 2.7).

2.8 (b). Suspects against Property Stolen

The total offences reported in 2023 was 8,400 with total number 3,115 of suspected persons,

Majority of suspect were males (2,972 person) as compared to female (143 person). Mjini district recorded the highest number of suspect with 752 (24.1 percent) of the total suspects against property stolen while Mkoani recorded the least with 24 suspect (0.8 percent).

The number of suspected persons against property stolen increased by 85.2 percent from 1, 682 persons in 2022 compared to 3,115 persons in 2023. Suspected male increased by 83.5 percent from 1,622 persons in 2022 to 2,972 persons in 2023 and female suspect increased from 60 persons to 143 persons respectively (Table 2.8).

2.9 Victims and Suspects against Humanity

The total of 2,054 victims and 2,061 suspects were recorded in 2023. Female comprises higher number of victims (1,524 persons) while male comprises higher number of suspect (1,924 persons). Rape to girl cases recorded the highest number of victims (822 persons) and suspects (826 persons) followed by Assaults victims (376 persons) and suspects (376 persons).

The number of victims decreased by 44.7 percent from 1,419 persons in 2022 to 2,054 persons in 2023 and suspects increased by 55.4 percent from 1,326 persons in 2022 to 2,061 persons in 2023. Female victims increased by 39.8 percent from 1,090 persons in 2022 to 1,524 persons in 2023 (Table 2.9).

2.10 Suspects against Tranquility

The total of 93 suspects were recorded in 2023 with higher number of males than females. Males were 67 suspects (72.0 percent) and females were 26 suspects (28.0 percent). Unlawful possession of Local Liquor suspects recorded the highest number of 54 (58.1 percent) followed by Trading without License having 23 suspects (24.7 percent).

The number of suspects decreased by 72.1 from 333 in 2022 to 93 persons in 2023. Female suspects decreased from 32 in 2022 to 26 persons in 2023 and male decreased to 67 in 2023 from 301 persons in 2022 (Table 2.10).

CHAPTER THREE: COURT CASES

3.1 Introduction

This chapter presents the information on crime statistics from Judiciary of Zanzibar for the period of 2019 to 2023. The Judiciary of Zanzibar is established under the constitution of Zanzibar 1984 under the high court Act number 2 of 1985 and has been vested with the power to hear and entertain all matters brought before it. As for the subordinate courts, they are established under the Magistrate's court Act of 1985 and the Kadhi's court Act of 1985. The subordinate courts include regional magistrate courts, district and primary magistrate courts and the Kadhi's courts.

This report includes cases instituted in the high court, magistrate courts and Kadhi's courts from 2019 to 2023 and contains the filed cases, decided cases, appealed and pending cases before the courts, filed case means opened or a case filed before the court; decided cases means all cases that have been finished; appealed cases mean appeals that have been opened before the appellate Court whether District, Regional or High Court. In this chapter, the offences included are of all types of offences such as offences against morality, against body, against property, against the state to mention a few. The chapter contains civil and criminal cases as well as applications for both civil and criminal cases.

3.2 Court Cases

Court cases are a dispute between opposing parties resolved by a court, or by some equivalent court process. It may be both civil or criminal case in each court case there is an accuser and one or more defendants

A civil case, more commonly known as a lawsuit or controversy, begins when a plaintiff files a document called a complaint with a court, informing the court of the wrong that the plaintiff has allegedly suffered because of the defendant, and requesting a remedy.

A criminal case, in common law jurisdictions, begins when a person suspected of a crime is indicted by a grand jury or otherwise charged with the offense by a government official calleda prosecutor or district attorney.

3.3 High Court Criminal Cases

The number of filed cases in the high court in 2023 was 83 cases of which 13 cases were decided and 70 cases are still pending before the court. The clearance rate in 2023 was 15.7.

The number of filed cases decreased from 145 in 2022 to 83 cases in 2023 but the clearance rate increased form 5.5. to 15.7 to the same years.

Drugs trafficking recorded the highest number (58) of filed cases in the High Court in 2023 followed by Murder with 11 cases while infanticide have no cases filed.

The number of drugs trafficking offences filed was 58 in 2023 while in previous year was 110 cases were filed. The higher number may be attributed due to the enact of new law an Act of Establishment of Authority Prevention of Drugs No. 8 of 2021 (Table 3.2).

3.3.1 Criminal Appeal

The number of criminal appeals filed at High Court in 2023 was 120 cases, of which 51 appeals were decided and 69 are still pending before the court. The clearance rate in 2023 was 42.5.

The criminal appeals filed increased from 92 in 2022 to 120 in 2023. The Clearance rate has decreased to 42.5 percent in 2023 compared with 35.9 percent recorded in 2022 (Table 3.3).

3.3.2 Criminal Application

Application may be in either criminal case or civil case. This mostly attached in main case it can appear in any level of Court. In criminal case it may involves habeascoupas, bail and others. On other hand in civil case may occurs restriction of using land or property that suit, stay of execution of decree, custody or maintenance to the child and so on.

Criminal application opened in the high court in 2023 was 181 of which 93 application (51.4 percent) were decided and 88 application (48.6 percent) are still pending before the court.

The number of criminal application opened decreased from 211 in 2022 to 181 application in 2023. The clearance rate has increased to 51.4 in 2023 compared with 46.4 in 2022, (Table 3.5).

3.4 Civil Cases in High Court

The number of civil cases filed in the high court in 2023 was 94 of which six (6) were decided and 88 cases (93.6 percent) are still pending before the court.

The number of complaints in 2023 was 94 of which 82 were male and 12 were female. The defendants was 94 of which 76 were Male and 18 were Female. The female complainants in the year 2023 were eight (8) in the age of 26 to 35 and that of defendants was 34 at age 36-45 (Table 3.8).

The number of complainants of both sexes aged increased by 40.3 percent from 67 complaints in 2022 to 94 complaints in 2023 and that of defendants increased by 13.3 percent from 83 to 94 defendants.

3.5 Regional Magistrate Courts

It is a trial court and has an original jurisdiction and an appellate jurisdiction. The presiding officer is termed a Regional magistrate. In its criminal jurisdiction, the Court may deal with a criminal offence at the level of Regional Magistrate Court as provided under first schedule of Criminal Procedure Act no 7 of 2018. In addition, at civil jurisdiction, the Court may deal with all civil case as shown in Magistrate Court Act.

3.5.1 Criminal Cases

Criminal case, in common law jurisdictions, begins when a person suspected of a crime is indicted by a grand jury or otherwise charged with the offense by a government official called a prosecutor or district attorney.

3.5.1.1 Regional Magistrate Courts

The number of cases filed in the Regional Magistrate Courts in 2023 was 1,139 cases of which 618 cases were decided and 521 cases (45.7 percent) are cases pending before the courts.

The number of cases filed decreased by 4.6 percent from 1,194 recorded in 2022 to 1,139 cases in 2023. The clearance rate increased from 48.6 in 2022 to 54.3 in 2023,

(Table 3.11).

The proportion of population accused tends to peak in adolescence or early adulthood and then declines with increasing age as shown in the Figure 3.1 and Table 3.13. It is indisputable fact that age is one of the strong factors associated with criminal behavior.

A comparison between the number of cases and number of accused in 2023, out of 1,139 filed cases reported, 1,211 were accused. This means that some of the accused had more than one cases, and this trends shown in all the years (2019 - 2023).

Mjini Magharibi contributed more than one quarter (52.1 percent) 631 persons of all accused reported in 2023, followed by Kusini Pemba (167 persons) while Kaskazini Pemba recorded the least (114 persons).

The number of accused increased by 8.1 percent from 1,120 in 2022 to 1,211 in 2023 (Table 3.13 and Figure 3.2).




Figure 3. 1: Number of accused by Age group, 2022-2023




Figure 3. 2: Number of Cases and Accused in 2019–2023

3.9. Crime Rate

The data show that in 2023, a total crime rate in Zanzibar was 212 per 100,000 populations in 2023. Region with a highest crime rate was Kusini Unguja with 250 crimes per 100,000 populations followed by Mjini Magharibi with 239 crimes per 100,000 populations while Kaskazini Pemba region had the least crime rate of 160 crimes per 100,000 populations in 2023.

The crime rate in 2023 decreased to 212 crimes per 100,000 populations from 804 per 100,000 populations in 2022 (Table 3.26).

3.10 Kadhi's Court

Part six of the Constitution of Zanzibar of 1984 establishes the judicial arm of the state. The Constitution empowers the House of Representatives to establish other courts subordinate to the High Court and those courts so established shall be vested with power and jurisdiction as shall be provided by law. In 1985, the Kadhi's Court Act was enacted. It established the Kadhi's Court in each district and the Chief Kadhi's Court, with jurisdiction that was restricted to the determination of questions of Muslim law relating to personal status, marriage, divorce or inheritance, in proceedings in which all parties professed the Muslim religion.

Under the 1985 Act, appeals from the Kadhi's Court went to the Chief Kadhi's Court, which

lacked original jurisdiction but acted as an appellate court for the decisions of the Kadhi's Court. In 2003, the Kadhi's Court Act was amended. The amending Act established the Chief Kadhi's Court to be headed by the Chief Kadhi, the Deputy Kadhi's Court to be headed by the Deputy Chief Kadhi based in Unguja Island, and the Appellate Kadhi's Court to be headed by the Appellate Kadhi based in Pemba.

3.10.1 District Kadhi's Court

District Kadhi's Court with jurisdiction that was restricted to the determination of questions of Muslim law relating to personal status, marriage, divorce or inheritance, in proceedings in which all parties professed the Muslim religion in the district.

3.10.1.1 Civil Case Divorces at District Kadhi's Court

The number of divorce cases filed at Kadhi's courts in 2023 was 1,534, of which 966 were decided cases and 568 cases were pending before the court. The clearance rate in 2023 was 62.9.

The number of divorce cases filed increased from 1,469 cases in 2022 to 1,534 cases in 2023. The clearance rate raised to 62.9 percent in 2023 compared with 2022 (55.5 percent), (Table 3.27).

CHAPTER FOUR: INMATE AND REMAND STATISTICS

4.1 Introduction

This chapter presents the information about Institute of Education for Offenders composed of ten (10) correctional facilities, of which six (6) are located in Unguja Island and four (4) located in Pemba Island.

The Institute of Education for Offenders has the following functions:

- To receive, control and rehabilitate inmate
- To provide correction programs and facilities to all inmate that lead to change their behaviors as law-abiding citizens.
- To improve cooperation and collaboration with other Special Departments of Zanzibar and the Security Forces of the United Republic of Tanzania (URT).
- To improve production capacity through agriculture and livestock.

4.2 The Institute of Education for Offenders

The Institute of Education for Offenders of the Zanzibar is one of the five special Departments of the Zanzibar Revolutionary Government, which is under the President Office, Regional Administration, Local Governments and Special Departments. It was established under the Act No.1 of 1980 and its amendment of 2007.

The Institute of Education for Offenders is responsible for all rehabilitation and correction activities, which can be implemented by classifying the inmates into various wings such as male and female, juvenile and adults, short and long-term sentence serving group as well as inmate and remand group. These wings are well classified to give clear and understandable descriptions.

4.3 Inmates and Remands in Institute of Education Offenders




The total number of inmates in 2023 was 520, out of which 510 (98.1 percent) were male and 10 (1.9 percent) were female. The number of inmates were more observed in aged 18 - 35 with 363 inmates which representing 69.8 percent.

The number of inmates decreased to 520 inmates in 2023 from 785 inmates in 2022 the decrement is equivalent to 33.8 percent. The number of male inmates decreased from 720 in 2022 to 510 inmates in 2023 whiles the number of females decreased from 65 in 2022 to 10 inmates in 2023.

In 2023, inmates served different sentence duration depending on the type of offence. Most of the inmates 197 served three months and below followed by 148 inmates (28.5 percent) served between 4-11 months. Most females (40.0 percent) were sentence served 6 – 10 years while male served three months and below (197). There was no inmates served in Life imprisonment and death penalty since 2021.

The total number of remands in 2023 was 1,224, of which 1,201 (98.1 percent) were males and 23 (1.9 percent) were females. The larger number of remands (865) aged between 18-35 representing 70.7 percent of the total remand.

The number of remands decreased from 2,190 in 2022 to 1,224 in 2023 (44.1 percent) remands. The number of male remands decreased by 42.9 from 2,103 remand in 2022 to 1,201 in 2023 and for females decreased by 73.6 from 87 remand in 2022 to 10 in 2023 (Table 4.3).

Various vocational studies were introduced to inmates in order to comprehend the correctional purpose of the inmates. The skills provided include Agriculture, Carpentry, Tailoring, Livestock, Construction, Mending etc.

The total number of inmates who were given vocational training in 2023 was 508 whereby 501 were males and seven (7) were females. Males were participating in all trainings provided while females participated in only mending. Most of inmates participated in Construction (118 inmates).

Agriculture (89 inmates) and Prison Education Program (PEP) (82 inmates) while the least number of inmates were participated in Mending (7 inmates).

The number of inmates who were given vocational training in 2023 decreased by 27.7 percent from 703 in 2022 to 508 in 2023. Number of male inmates who received vocational training decreased to 501 in 2023 from 685 inmates in 2022 while the number of female inmates decreased from 18 inmates in 2022 to seven (7) mates in 2023 (Table 4.5).


