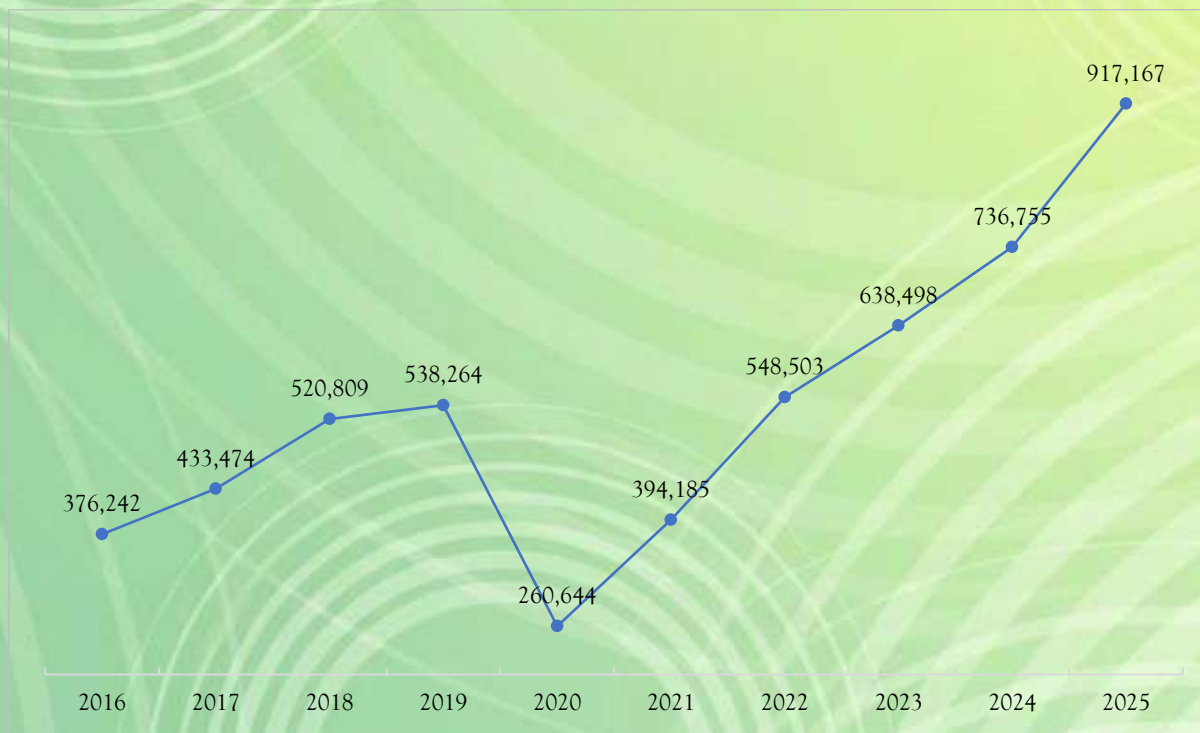

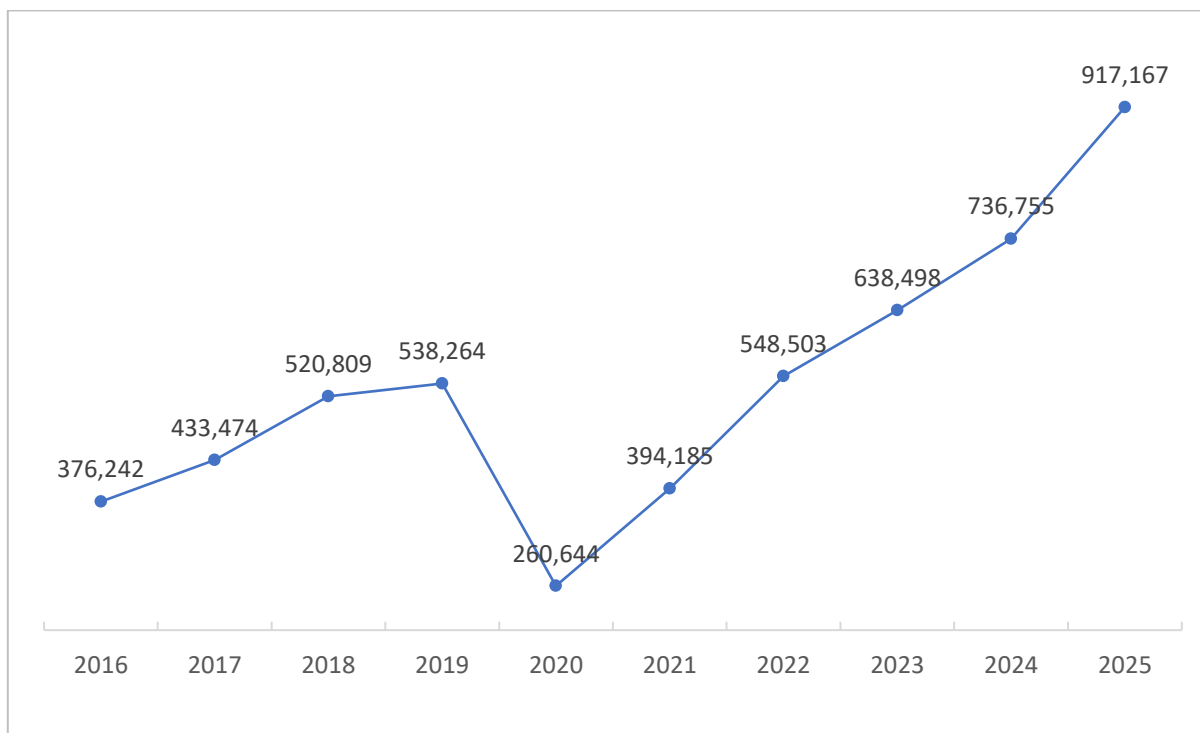
Number of Visitors Arrival 2016-2025

Vision

“To become a centre of excellence for statistical production and for promoting a culture of evidence-based policy and decision-making”.

Mission

“To coordinate production of official statistics, provide high quality statistical data and information and promote their use in planning, decision making, administration, governance, monitoring and evaluation”.

Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics

Principle 1: Relevance, Impartiality, and Equal Access

Official statistics provide an indispensable element in the information system of a democratic society, serving the Government, the economy and the public with data about the economic, demographic, social and environmental situation. To this end, official statistics that meet the test of practical utility are to be compiled and made available on an impartial basis by official statistical agencies to honor citizens’ entitlement to public information.

Principle 2: Professional Standards, Scientific Principles, and Professional Ethics

To retain trust in official statistics, the statistical agencies need to decide according to strictly professional considerations, including scientific principles and professional ethics, on the methods and procedures for the collection, processing, storage and presentation of statistical data.

Principle 3: Accountability and Transparency

To facilitate a correct interpretation of the data, the statistical agencies are to present information according to scientific standards on the sources, methods and procedures of the statistics.

Principle 4: Prevention of Misuse

The statistical agencies are entitled to comment on erroneous interpretation and misuse of statistics.

Principle 5: Sources of Official Statistics

Data for statistical purposes may be drawn from all types of sources, be they statistical surveys or administrative records. Statistical agencies are to choose the source with regard to quality, timeliness, costs and the burden on respondents.

Principle 6: Confidentiality

Individual data collected by statistical agencies for statistical compilation, whether they refer to natural or legal persons, are to be strictly confidential and used exclusively for statistical purposes.

Principle 7: Legislation

The laws, regulations and measures under which the statistical systems operate are to be made public.

Principle 8: National Coordination

Coordination among statistical agencies within countries is essential to achieve consistency and efficiency in the statistical system.

Principle 9: Use of International Standards

The use by statistical agencies in each country of international concepts, classifications and methods promotes the consistency and efficiency of statistical systems at all official levels.

Principle 10: International Cooperation

Bilateral and multilateral cooperation in statistics contributes to the improvement of systems of official statistics in all countries.

Guiding Principles of OCGS

The Office is committed to upholding values of Professionalism, Integrity, Confidentiality, Customer Focus, Innovation and Teamwork (PICCIT) as the guiding principles in the production of statistics.

Organization of OCGS

The management is vested to Zanzibar Statistics Board with Chief Government Statistician as the Chief Executive Officer of OCGS and a Member of Zanzibar Statistical Board.

Office of the Chief Government Statistician further comprises of five Directorates namely;

- a. Economic Statistics
- b. Social Statistics
- c. Statistical Standard, Coordination and Research
- d. Administration and Planning
- e. Pemba Sub-Office

Mandate of OCGS

To collect, analyze and disseminate statistical information. The Bureau is also the custodian of official statistical information, and coordinator of the National Statistical System.

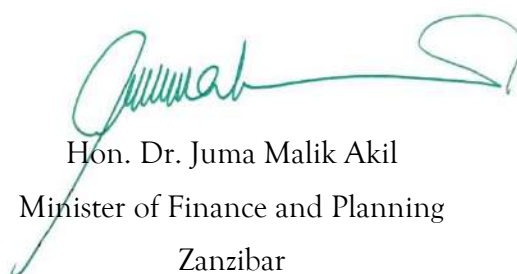
Foreword

Office of the Chief Government Statistician (OCGS) is committed to collect, analyse, produce and disseminate integrated statistical information that meets the National and International standards and quality requirements. The quality statistical information produced by the OCGS has been crucial in making informed decision on planning, implementation, monitoring, evaluation and reporting the plans, strategies, frameworks, policies etc. Specifically, data are required to feed indicators for monitoring the progress towards achieving goals of the Zanzibar Development Plan (ZADEP) which covers Calendar Years (CY) 2021 – 2026. Other requirements include, updating the international developments frameworks such as the United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs 2030), the Africa Union (AU) Agenda 2063, Southern Africa Development Community (SADC) and the East African Community (EAC) Agenda 2050.

This Statistical Abstract is the prime annual publication through which OCGS disseminates key statistical information derived from the latest censuses, surveys and administrative records from Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs), Local Governments Authorities (LGA's) and some Civil Society Organizations (CSO's). The administrative records presented in the Statistical Abstract 2025 covers statistics on Demographic, Socio-economic, Production and Macroeconomic sectors structured either in a Calendar Year (CY) that is January to December 2025 or Financial Year (FY) that is July to June.

The Office appreciates the continued cooperation of the MDA's, LGA's and CSO's in providing the requisite data for production of this publication. In a special way, I wish to thank the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar for continued support to the production of Statistical Abstract. The office welcomes constructive comments and idea from stakeholders that aim at enhancing the quality of its future publications.

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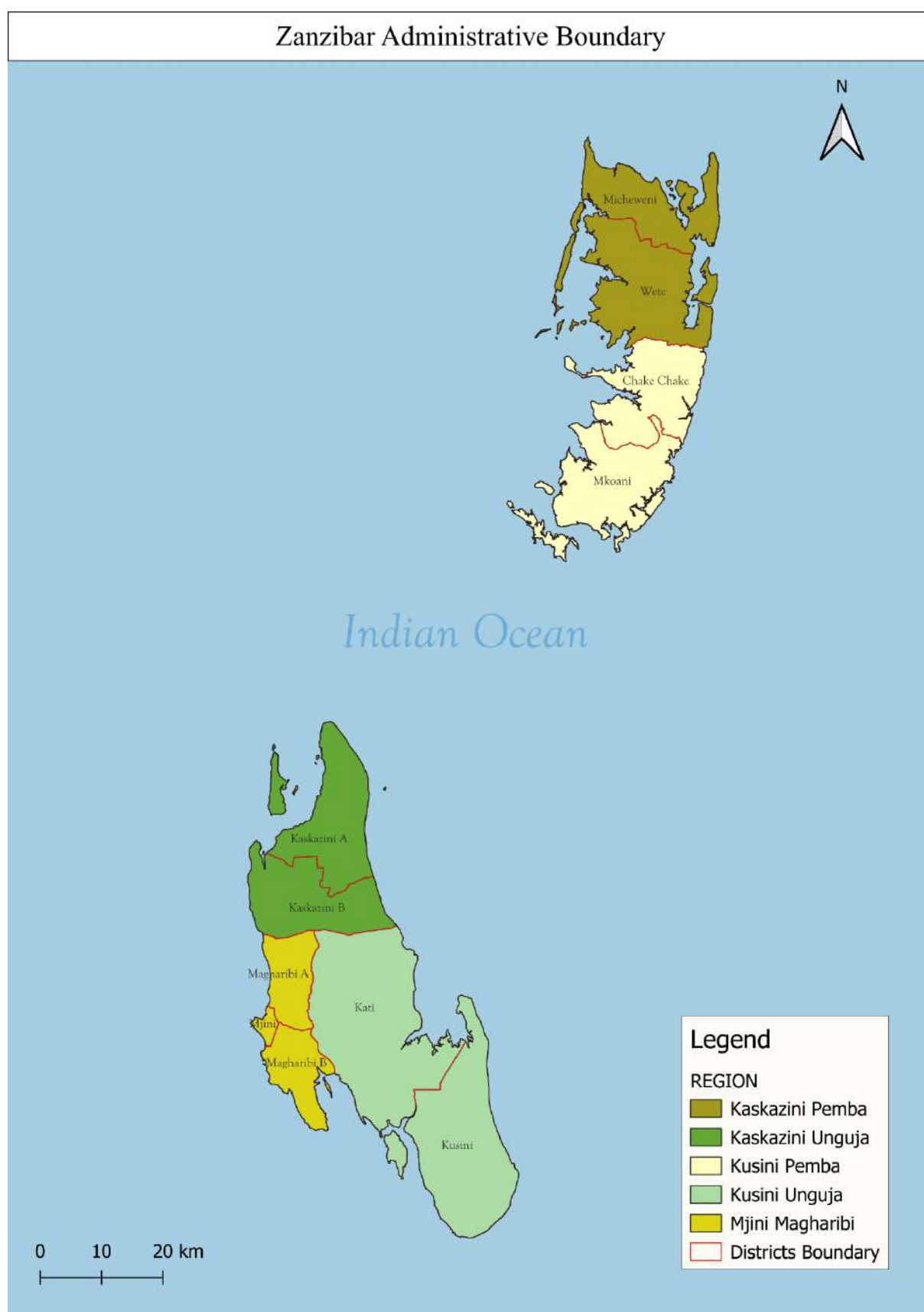

A. ADMINISTRATION AND GOVERNANCE

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar (RGoZ) was formed on 12th January 1964 under the first President, the late Hon. Abeid Amani Karume. The two independent states, People's Republic of Zanzibar and Republic of Tanganyika united on 26th April 1964 to form the United Republic of Tanzania (URT). Since then, Zanzibar has come to be part of the union but with its own elected President, Legislature as well as Judiciary System with exception of the Court of Appeal.

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar is now on its Eighth Phase under His Excellency, Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi since November 2020. Previous phases' Presidents were; Hon. Dr. Ali Mohamed Shein (2010 - 2020); Hon. Dr. Amani Abeid Amani Karume (2000 - 2010); Hon. Dr. Salmin Amour Juma (1990 - 2000); the Late, Hon. Idrisa Abdulwakil (1985 - 1990); the Late, Hon. Ali Hassan Mwinyi (1984 - 1985); the Late, Hon. Aboud Jumbe Mwinyi (1972 - 1984); and the Late, Hon. Abeid Amani Karume (1964 - 1972).

A.1 Administration

Zanzibar had 18 Members in the Revolutionary Council (which is also the Council of Ministers - a Cabinet), as of December 2025 comprised of 16 Ministers, a Second Vice President and an Attorney General. The Revolutionary Council is Chaired by His Excellency, Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi the President of the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar.

B. LAND AND CLIMATE

Land, Climate and Environment section presents key information on the natural environment and physical characteristics of Zanzibar. It is organized into two subsections: **Land**, which provides data on land use, land distribution, and related resources; and **Climate**, which covers weather patterns, rainfall, temperature, and other climatic conditions. Together, these statistics offer an overview of environmental conditions and trends in Zanzibar.

B.1 Land

Zanzibar is one of the Indian Ocean Island. It is situated on the Eastern Africa coast about 36.5 kilometres adjacent to Tanzania Mainland. It is a low-lying island of coral formation, with an area of about 2,654 square kilometres; of which 1,664 squares kilometres are for Unguja Island and 988 square kilometres are for Pemba. There are also a habitat and un-habitat islets.

The northern tip of Unguja Island is located at 5.72° South, 39.30° East, with the Southernmost point at 6.48° South, 39.51° East. It is separated from the Tanzania Mainland by a channel, which at its narrowest point is 36.5 km (22.7 mile) across. The island is about 85 km (53 mile) long and 39 km (24 mile) wide, with an area of 1,666 km² (643 sq. mile) which is mainly low lying, with its highest point being 120 m (394 ft). It is also characterised by beautiful sandy beaches with fringing coral reefs with enrich in marine biodiversity.

The northern tip of Pemba Island is located at 4.87° south, 39.68° east, and the southernmost point is located at 5.47° south, 39.72° east. The island is separated from the Tanzania Mainland by a channel some 56 km (35 mile) wide. The island is about 67 km (42 mile) long and 23 km (14 mile) wide, with an area of 988 km² (381 sq. mile). Pemba is also mainly low lying, with its highest point being 95 m (312 ft).

B.2 Climate

Zanzibar experience warm and humid climatic condition (equatorial). There are four seasons in a year, namely masika, the main rainy season, March to May; kipupwe, the cold season, June to August; vuli, short rainy season September to November; and kaskazi, the hot season December to March. The average highest rain in 2025 was recorded in April, 429.1 mm for 21 days in Unguja and 710.3 mm was recorded in May for 26 Days in Pemba as shown in table B.2.1 below.

Zanzibar has a tropical monsoon climate (Am). The heat of summer (corresponding to the Northern Hemisphere winter) is often cooled by strong sea breezes associated with the northeast monsoon, kaskazi, particularly on the north and east coasts. Being near to the equator, the islands are warm year round. The rainfall regime is split into two main seasons, a primary maximum in March, April, and May in association with the southwest monsoon, kusi, and a secondary maximum in November and December. The months in between receive less rain, with a minimum in July.

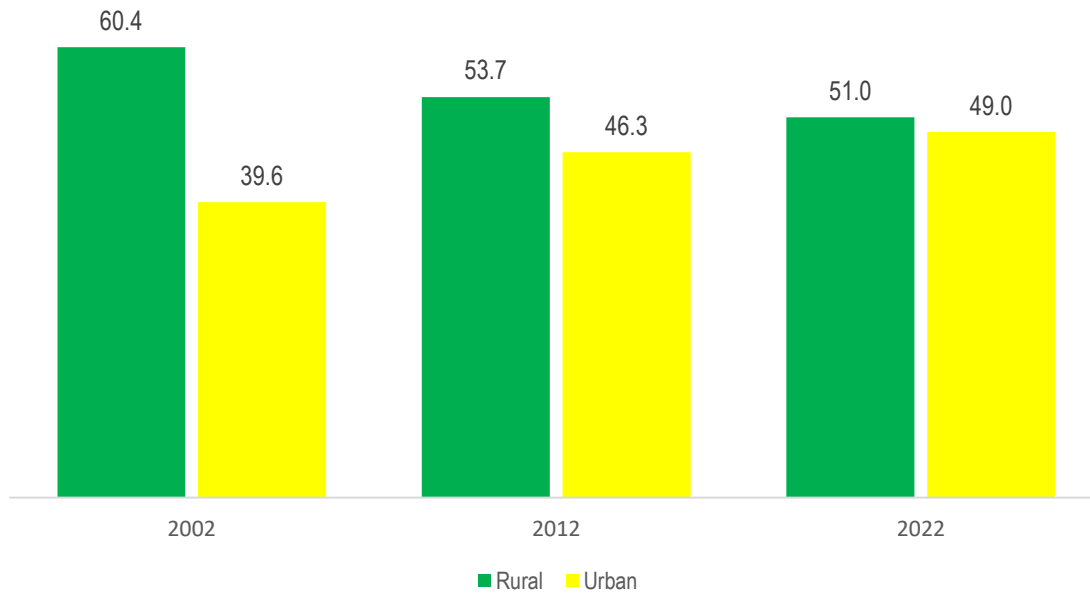

Figure C.1.1: Percentage Distribution of Population Living in Rural and Urban Areas, 2002, 2012 and 2022



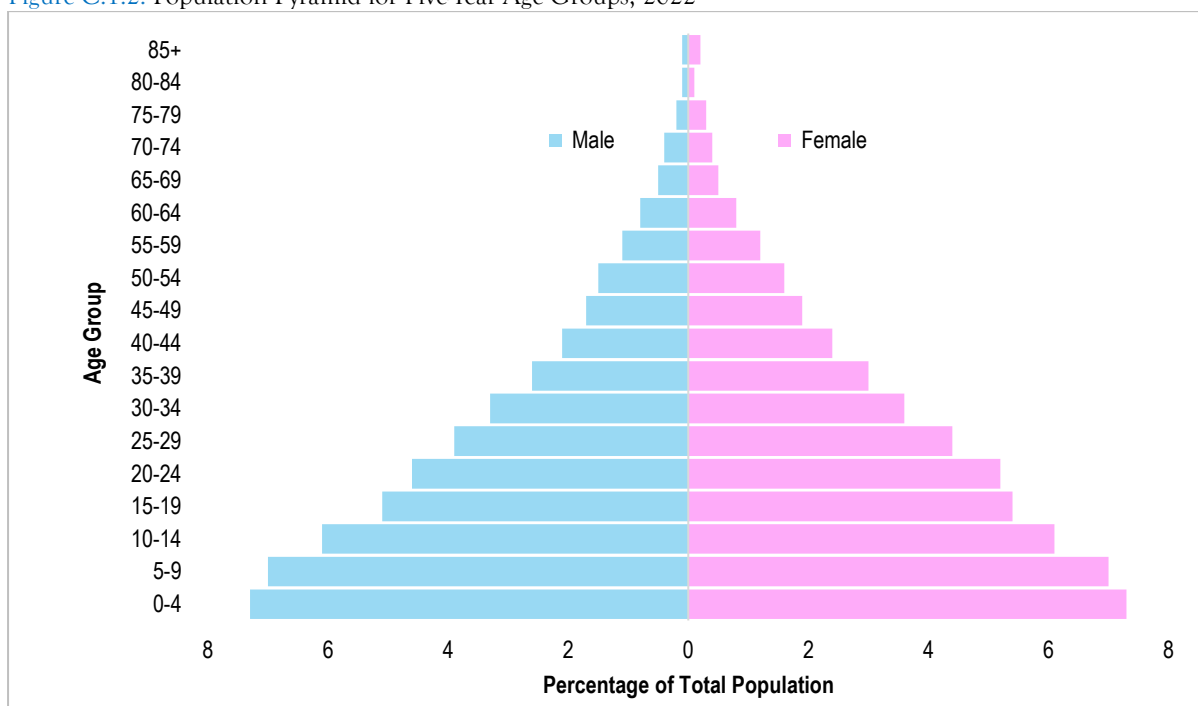

Figure C.1.3: Population Density, 1967- 2022

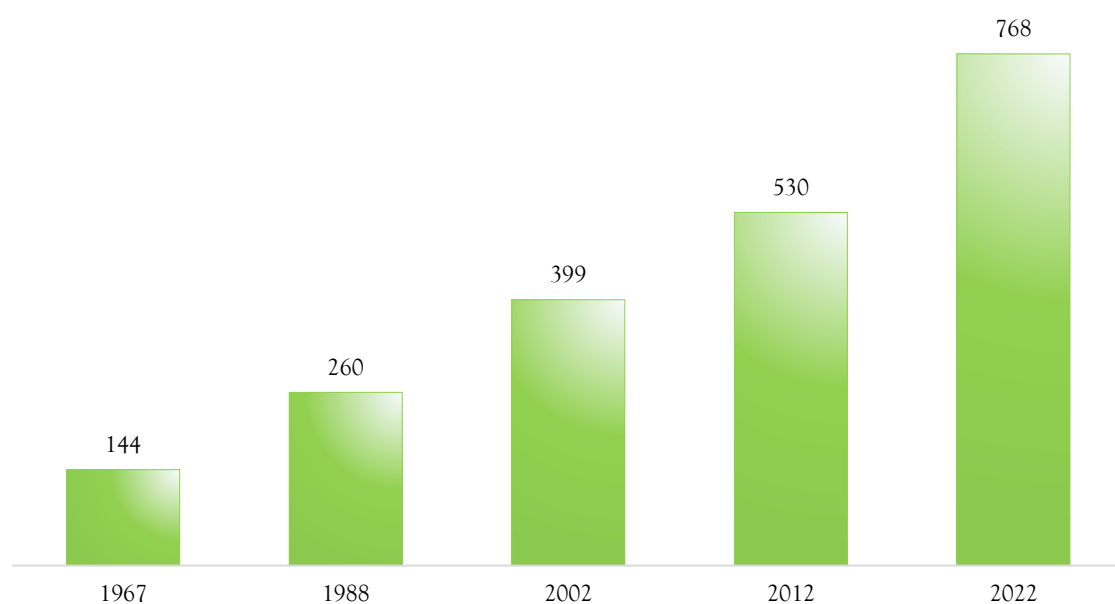

Figure C.1.4: Average Household Size by Region, 2022

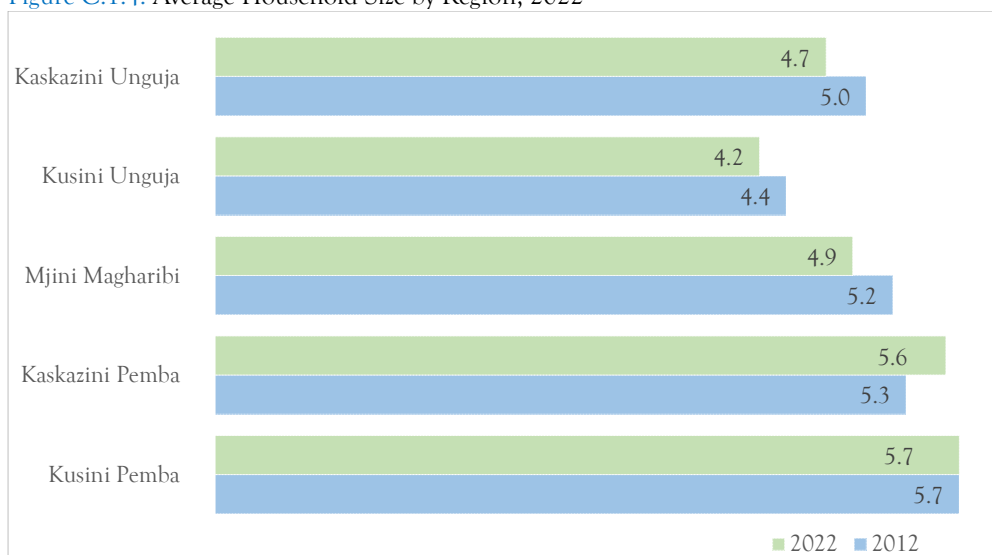
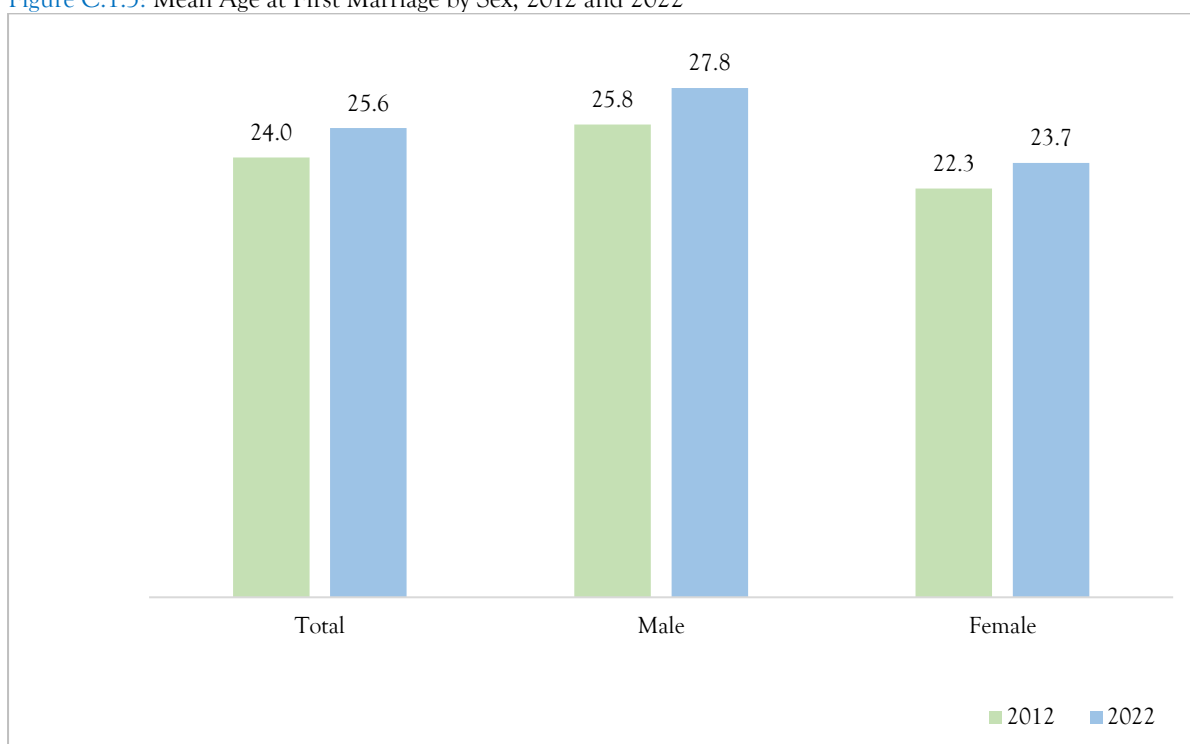


Figure C.1.5: Mean Age at First Marriage by Sex, 2012 and 2022

It is organized into several subsections: **Education**, which provides data on enrolment, infrastructure, and educational attainment; **Health**, which covers health facilities, services, and major health indicators; **Gender**, which highlights issues related to equality and empowerment; **Social Welfare**, which focuses on support services for vulnerable groups; **Crime**, which presents statistics on reported offences and related trends; and **Sober Houses and Drug Addiction**, which provide information on rehabilitation services and substance abuse patterns.

Figure E.1.1: Percentage Point Contributions to Change in Real GDP by Industry, 2025

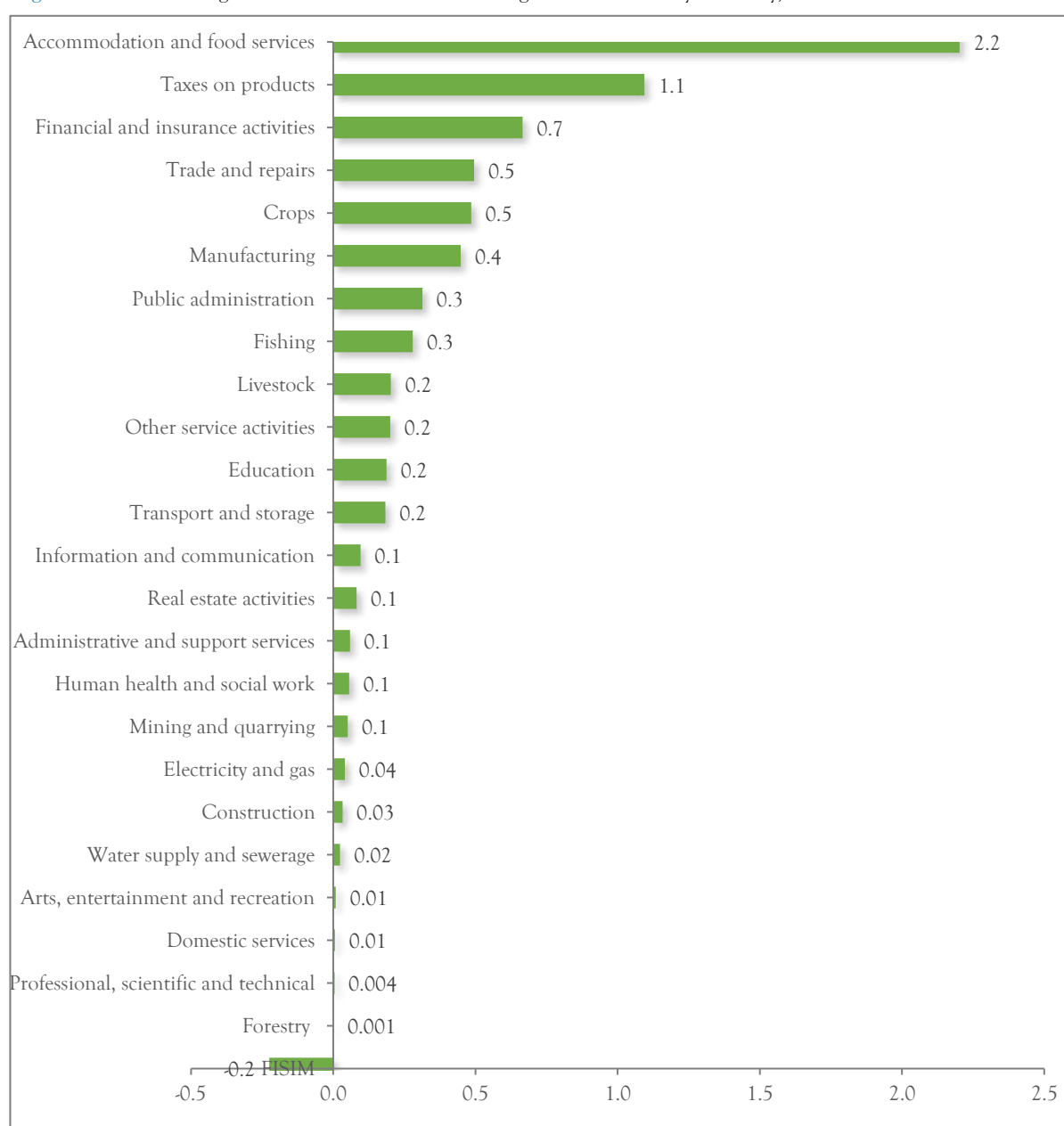

Figure E.3.1: Value of Imports and Exports, 2016 - 2025

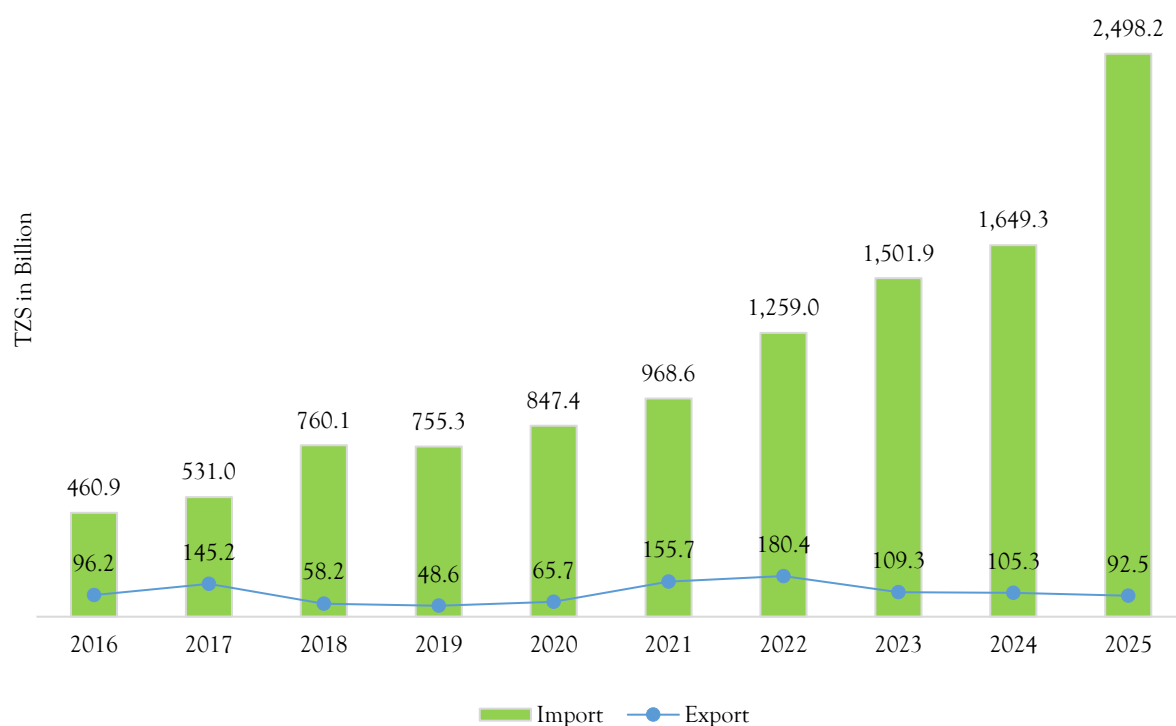

Figure E.3.2: Quantity of Exports of Main Cash Crops, 2016-2025

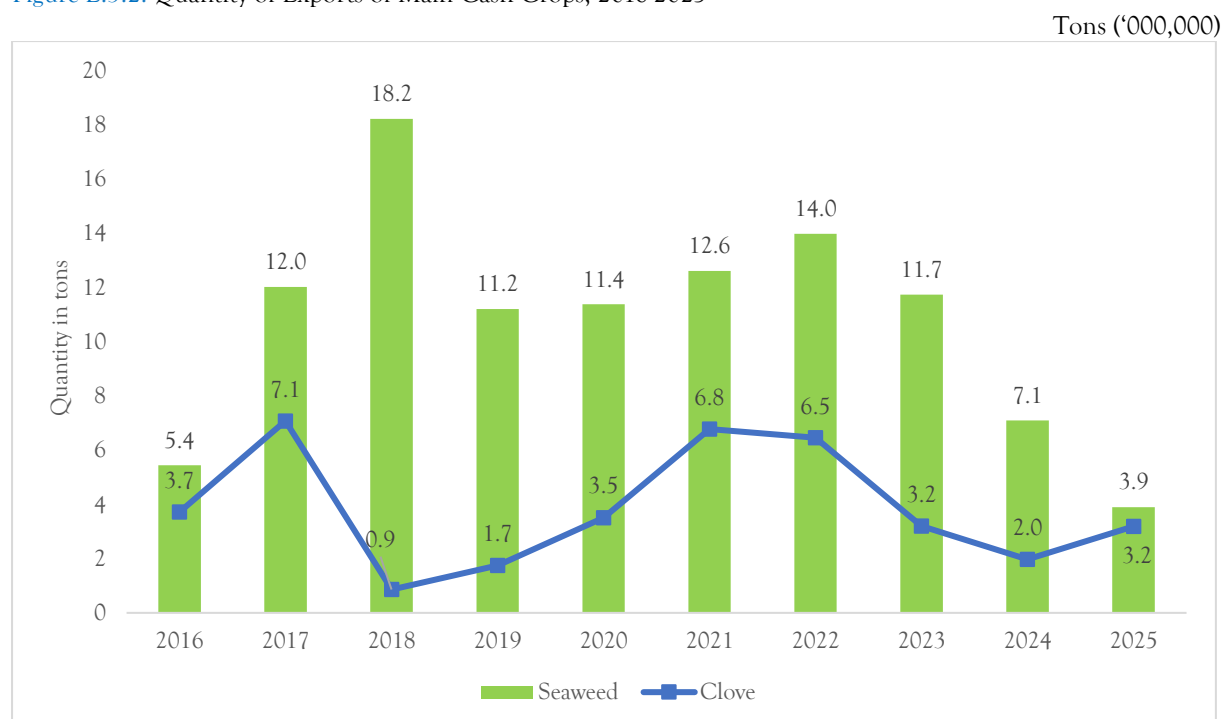


Figure E.3.3: The value of Export of Main Cash Crops, 2016 -2025

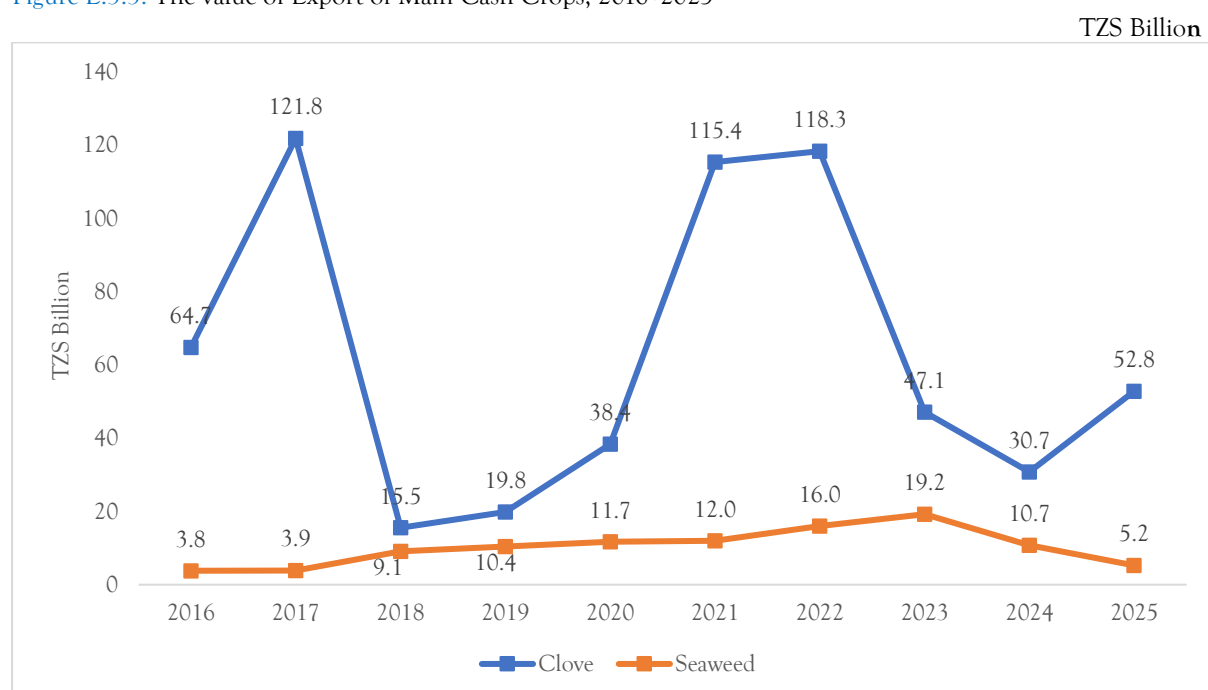

Figure E.3.4: Quantity of Imported Main Food Staff, 2016-2025

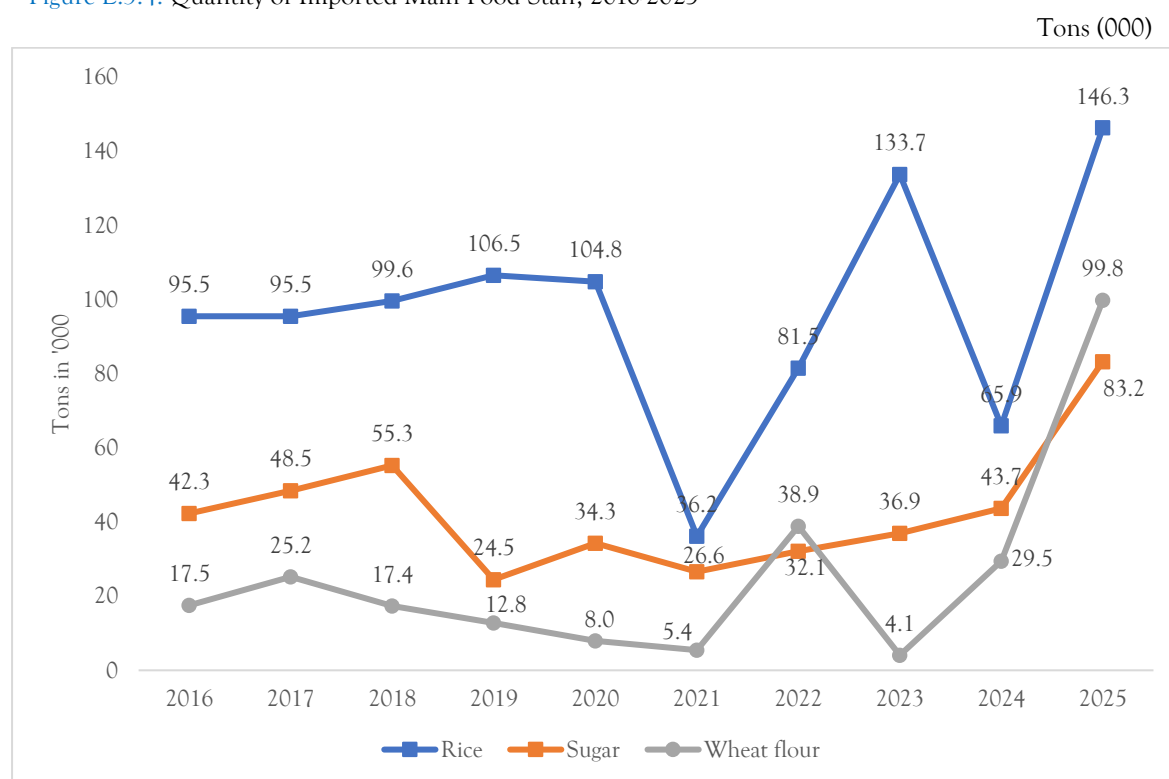


Figure E.3 5: Value of Imported Main Food Staff, 2016-2025

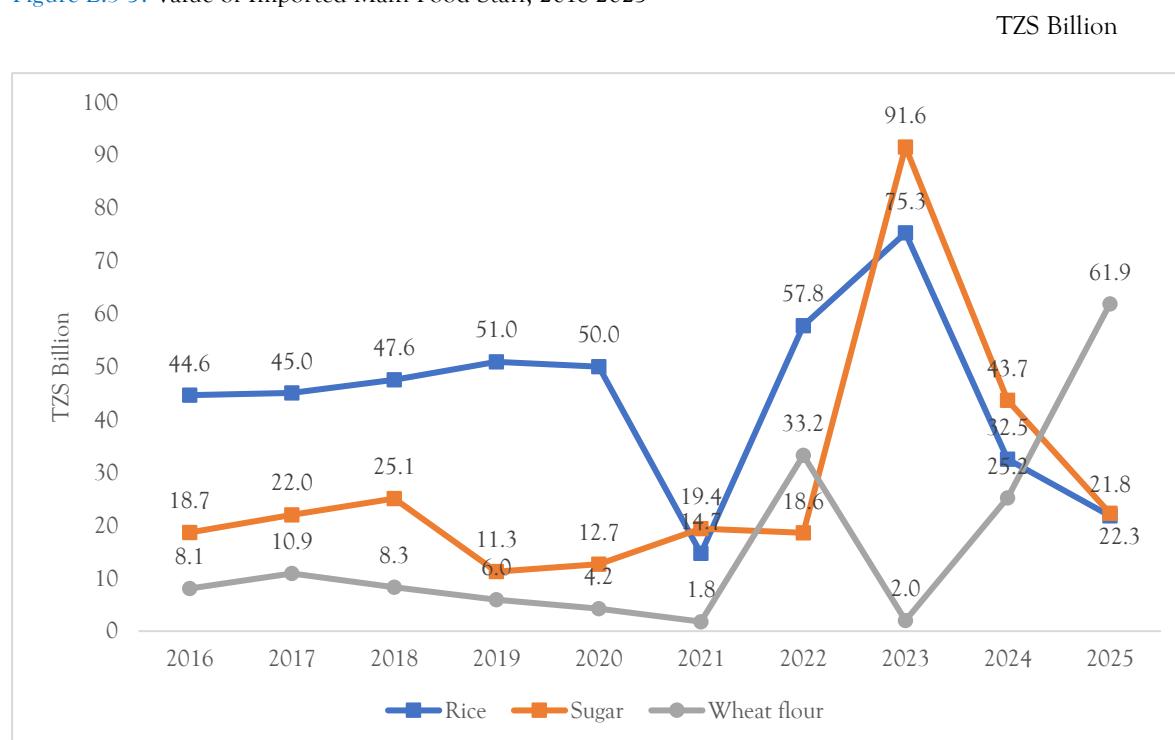

Figure E.3.6: Quantity of Imports Fuel Products, 2016-2025

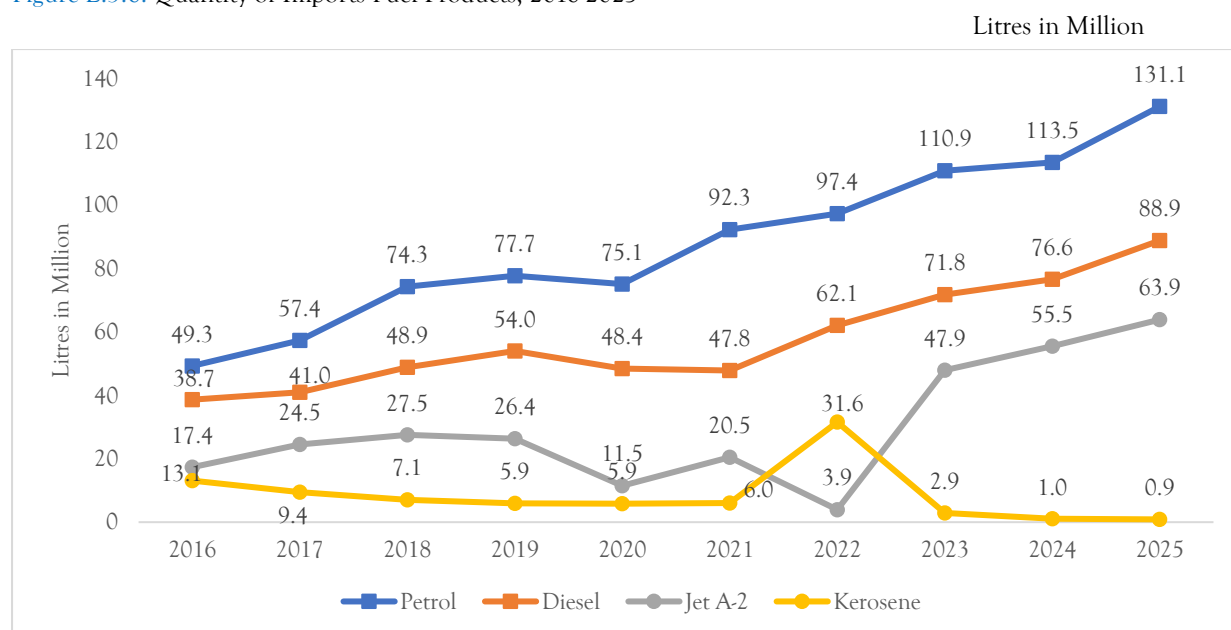


Figure E.3.7: The value of Imported Fuel Products, 2016-2025

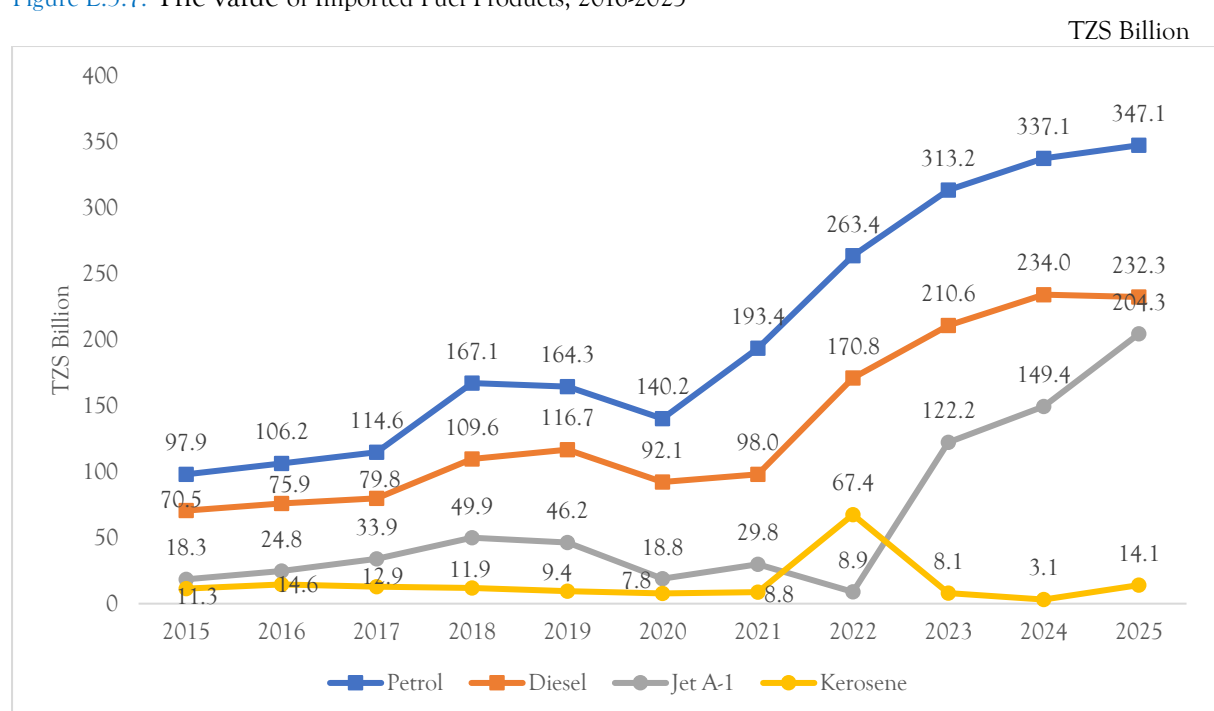


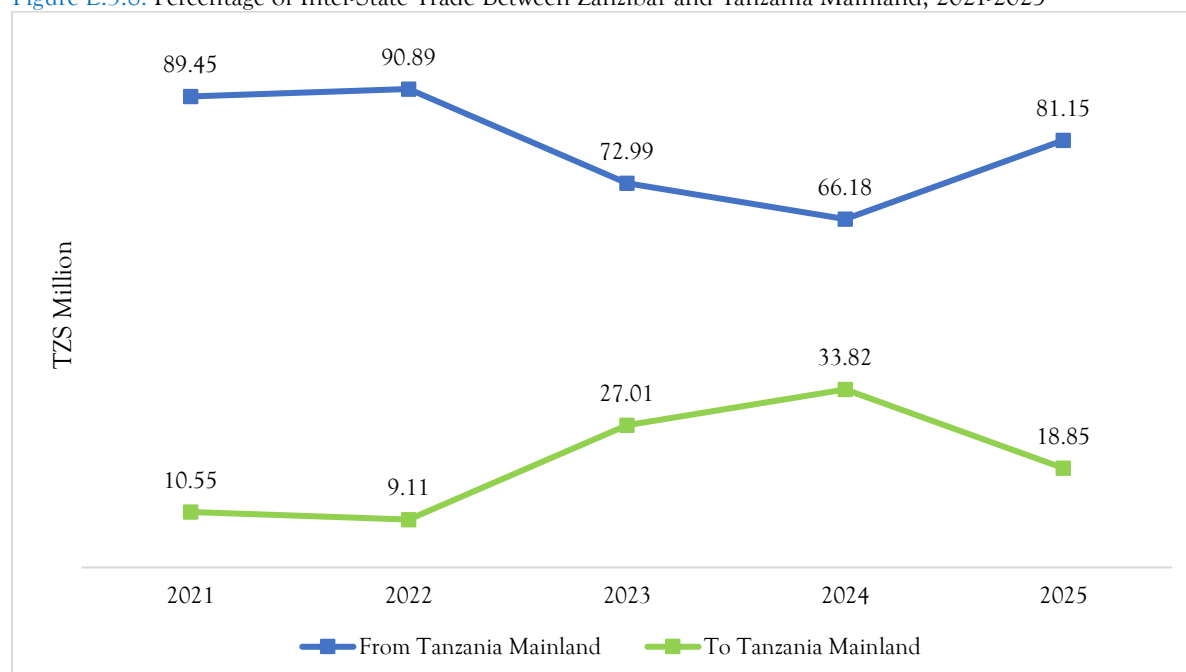

Figure E.4.1: Annual Inflation Rate, 2016-2025

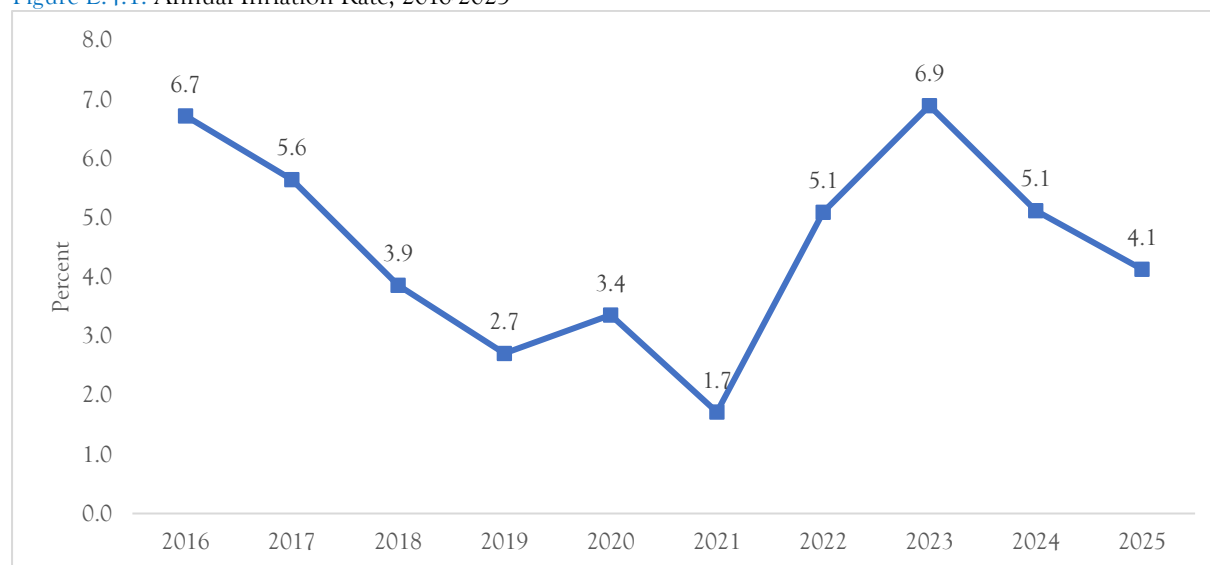


Figure E.4.2: Food and Non-Food Annually Inflation Rate, 2016-2025

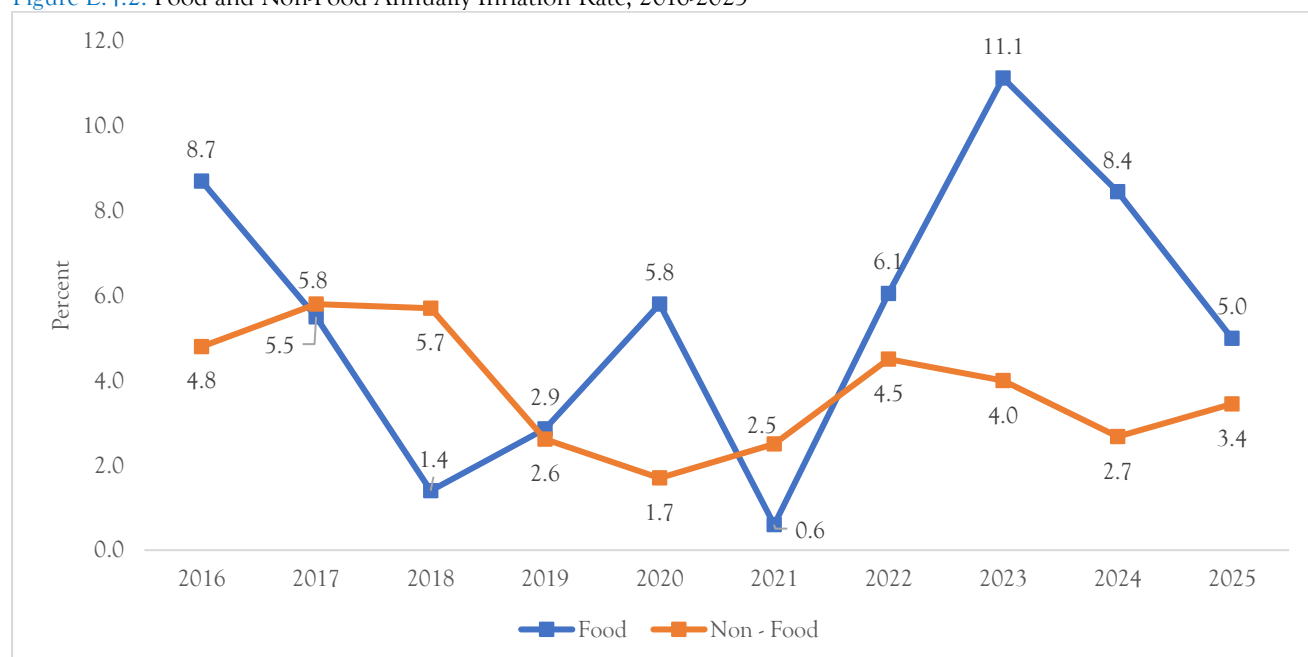

Figure G.1.1: Number of Tourist Arrivals, 2016-2025

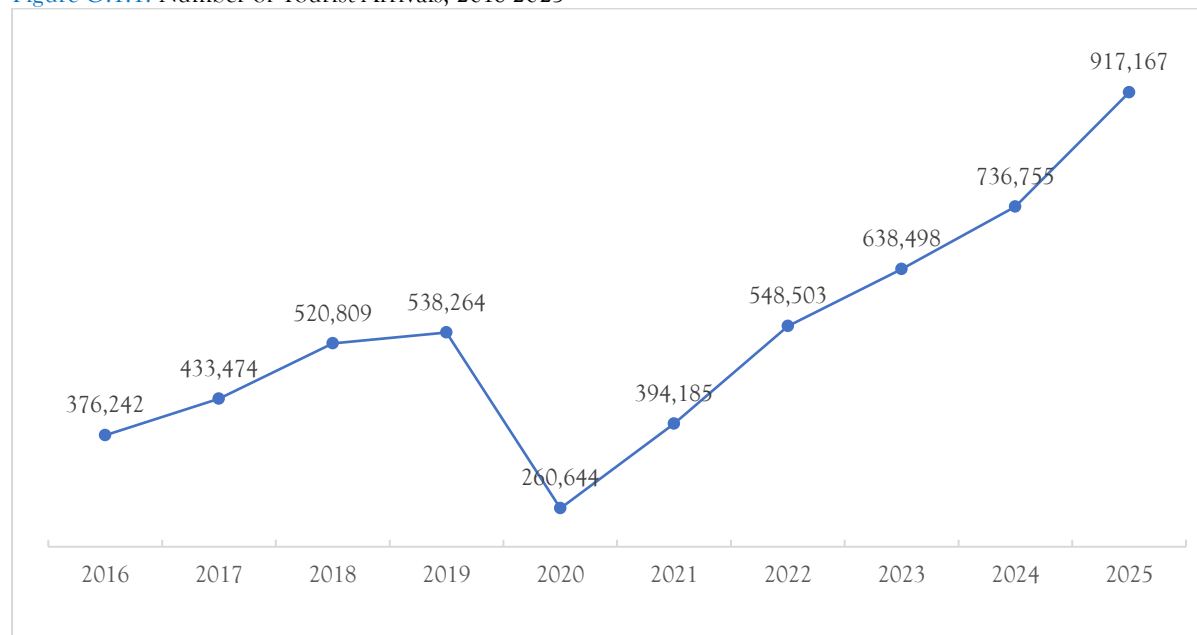
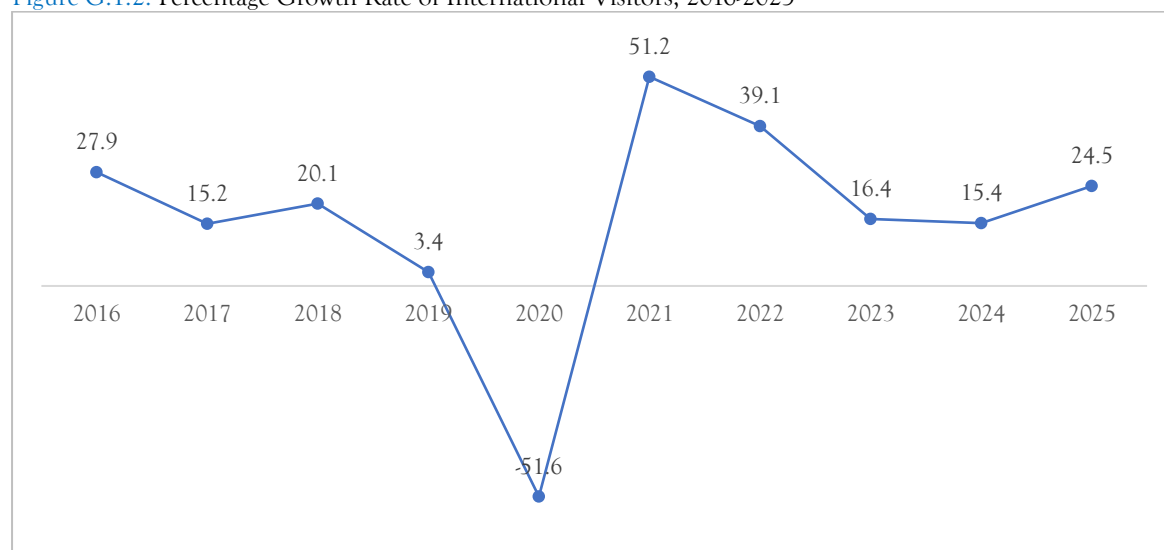


Figure G.1.2: Percentage Growth Rate of International Visitors, 2016-2025
