

#### A. LAND AND CLIMATE

#### A.1 Land

Zanzibar Islands lies in the Indian Ocean off the coast of Eastern Africa. It is situated about 30 kilometers from the mainland of East Africa. It is a low-lying island of coral formation, with an area of about 2,654 square kilometers; of which 1,666 square kilometers are for Unguja island and 988 square kilometers are for Pemba. There are also a number of habitat and unhabitat islets.

Cloves and seaweed are grown for export; fishing is also important to the local economy. Recently tourism has emerged to be the main source of revenues for the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar (RGZ). The islands' main sea port is located at Zanzibar Stone Town situated on the western coast. It has a fine landlocked harbor with docking facilities for both passengers and cargo ships. The main airport is Abeid Amani Karume International Airport situated in the western part of the main town.

#### A.2 Climate

The Zanzibar climate is warm and humid (equatorial). There are four seasons in a year, namely "Masika" which is the main rainy season, experienced between March and May; Kipupwe the cold season, in the months of June to August; "Vuli", short rainy season during the months of September to November and "Kaskazi", the hot season which is experienced from December to February. The average highest peak of rain in 2019; Unguja and Pemba were recorded in May and October (Table A.2.1). The islands experienced high humidity between 68 and 88 percent in 2019 as shown in Table A.2.3.

#### **B.** ADMINISTRATION AND POLITICS

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar was formed on 12<sup>th</sup> January, 1964 under his first President, the late Hon. Abeid Amani Karume. The two independent states, Zanzibar and Tanganyika, then united on 26<sup>th</sup> April 1964 to form the United Republic of Tanzania (URT). Since then Zanzibar has come to be part of the union but with its own elected President, Legislature as well as Judiciary System (except for the Court of Appeal).

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar is now on its seventh phase and it is governed by His Excellency, Dr. Ali Mohamed Shein since 2010. This phase is operating through the Government of National Unity after the changes in the Zanzibar Constitution which allowed the opposition party to be included in the Government. Previous Presidents were;

#### C POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHIC STATISTICS

Population is the totality of all units of interest in a study or investigation at a given time and a given area. Population studies analyze the relationships between economic, social, cultural and biological processes influencing populations.

#### **C.1** Population Characteristics

The population of Zanzibar as recorded in 2012 Tanzania Population and Housing Census (2012 TPHC) was 1,303,569; growing at a rate of 2.8 percent per annum. The sex ratio of the population was 95, meaning that for every 100 females there are only 95 males. The population density for Zanzibar increased from 530 person/sq.km in 2012 to 603 person/sq.km in 2019, whereby Unguja and Pemba have 669 person/sq.km and 503 person/sq.km, respectively. The average household size is 5.1 (Table C.1.5), which confirms the predominance of large households, especially in the three regions (Mjini Magharibi, Kaskazini and Kusini Pemba).

The spatial composition suggests that 68.8 percent of the population is in Unguja island. The proportion of population in Pemba island has gradually declined, from 46.3 percent in 1967 to 31.2 percent in 2012; while that of Mjini Magharibi – the center of attraction from all Zanzibar administrative regions and parts of Eastern Africa – has been steadily growing. It is estimated that half of the Zanzibar population currently live in Mjini Magharibi.

The projected population for the year 2020 is 1,671,598 out of which male is 814,159 and female is 857,439 (Table C.1.4). Population projections are useful in development planning, local administration, research, learning institutions and private business enterprises.

#### D. SOCIAL STATISTICS

Social statistics comprise of data series from various sectors including education, health, crime statistics and social welfare (people with disability, orphans' care and old people care).

#### **D.1** Education

A total of 85,974 pupils were enrolled in pre-primary schools in 2019; of which 47,604 pupils (55.4 percent) were in private schools. This enrollment level marks an increase of 15.4 percent compared with the previous year (**Table1.5**). Enrolment in primary schools increased by 5.9 percent to 290,510 pupils in 2019 compared with 276,858 pupils in 2018 (**Table D.1.8**).

The Zanzibar Higher Education Loan Board (ZHELB) has provided loans to 4,040 students in the academic year 2019/2020; of whom 1,860 students were among the new selected applicants. The number of new applicants who received loans from ZHELB in this academic year increased by eight percent compared with the previous year (**Table D.1.23**).

## **D.2** Health Statistics

The aim of the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar is to provide free health services for all, with particular emphasis to women and children. This evolves from the Government's understanding that national development and good health for the population cannot be separated. This is well stated under Zanzibar's Development Plan "Vision 2020" and the Zanzibar Strategy for Growth and Reduction of Poverty (ZSGRP - MKUZA).

Levels of health care services have been categorized under UNICEF's system for health facilities as Public Health Care Units (PHCU)/dispensaries; Public Health Care Centers (PHCC)/cottage hospitals and General Hospitals. The Government's intention is to provide free health services at all these levels.

#### Mode of data collection

Data on health services are produced by the Ministry of Health, Zanzibar through its Health Management Information System (HMIS). The system obtains health data from primary sources (i.e. routine data) as well as secondary data (population censuses, national and other related health surveys). Routine data are predominantly collected from public, private and NGO's health facilities while censuses and surveys information are obtained from the Office of Chief Government Statistician. Data on in-patients, out-patients and admissions are collected quarterly while other information is collected annually.

This section covered the information of heath personnel, number of health facilities for public and private hospital, number of live birth at health facility, number of reported dose given to the children, number of visiting outpatient and in-patients.

The number of Primary Health Care Unit (PHCU) increased from 119 health facilities in 2018 to 125 health facility in 2019 (**Table D.2.1**). Referral hospital, district hospital and specially hospital remain the same. The number of health personnel increased from 2,552 staff in 2018 to 3,265 staff in 2019 (**Table D.2.3**). The number of livebirth at health facility increased from 41,360 livebirth in 2018 to 48,100 livebirth in 2019 (**Table D.2.4**). The number of houses sprayed with malaria prevention was 94,339 houses out of 99,126 targeted equivalent to 95.2 percentage coverage in 2019 (**Table D.2.8**).

The number of sober houses in 2019 remains the same with eight (8) recorded in 2018, Six of these sober houses are located in Unguja and two in Pemba. The number of residents in sober houses are highly increased from 259 residents in 2018 to 401 residents in 2019 equivalent to 55 percent, where large number of residents in sober house fall at the age group 26-35 and 36-45 accounted for 241 residents in sober houses and 100 residents in sober houses respectively (**Table D.3.2**).

## **D.4** Crime Statistics

Crime is an action or omission which constitutes an offences and is punishable by law. Crime is usually secretive by nature, rendering their measurements difficult, moreover criminal and traffic incidents are divided into two parts, major and minor. Crime statistics attempt to provide statistical measures of crimes in the society. Several approaches are used to capture crime statistics, including household, hospital and insurance records. Data are compiled by Police and similar law enforcement agencies. Typically, official crime statistics are from law enforcement agencies, although some offences are likely to go unreported to the Police.

#### **Recorded Road Accidents**

Table D.4.1 shows that the total number of accidents recorded in 2019 were 301 which involved 556 victims. The highest number of persons died during the accidents were cyclist (181) followed by pedestrians (112). These two accounted for 52.7 percent of all persons died in the accidents. The traffic offences have been decreasing with an average of two (2) percent annual growth rate in the last five years, and marks an decrease of 29.9 percent in 2019 compared with the previous year. Non-Compliance with guidelines and traffic regulations is sighted as the main driver to offenses.

#### **Crime Cases**

Table D.4.6 shows that the number of serious cases decreased by 13.2 percent to 2,109 in 2019 from 2,431 in 2018; although 42.1 percent of accidents for the year were serious cases. Mjini district reported the highest number of total cases (827) followed by Magharibi "A" district (815), while Micheweni and Kati districts reported the least (192 and 105 respectively).

### **Offences against Persons**

Number of offences against persons decreased by 5.5 percent to 1,578 in 2019 from 1,669 in 2018, this was highly attributed reported cases of rape to girls, indecent assault and abduction (Table D.4.10).

#### **Prison Statistics**

Most (53.2 percent) remands are males in the age range 18-30 years old (Table D.4.8).

### **Juvenile Court Cases**

Table D.4.11 shows that the number of juvenile criminal filed cases decreased from 103 in 2018 to 86 in 2019; About 37.2 percent of the cases in 2019 were decided and the rest were pending before the court.

### **D.5 GENDER STATISTICS**

Gender refers to a range of socially constructed roles and relationships, personality, traits, attitudes, behaviours, and values as determined by sexually biological differences between women and men, and of girls and boys. Gender statistics are needed to measure and monitor the realities of the lives of women and men, and of girls and boys. A broad diversity of topics and issues is covered under the heading of gender statistics, reflecting the changing roles of women and men in society, in the economy and in families and households.

### **D.5.1** Gender Statistics

Gender statistics are defined as statistics that adequately reflect differences and inequalities in the situation of women and men in all areas of life (United Nations, 2006). The Government policy and legal frameworks offer opportunities for promoting gender equality in government positions and enhance the gender representation in private and other institutions through the developed policies, strategies and the set law.

Zanzibar Gender Policy is an outcome of several efforts including Women Protection and Development Policy of 2001. It takes into consideration the implementation of the aforementioned international, regional treaties, conventions and declarations, in addition to the national policies and commitments, towards achieving gender equality and women empowerment from the highest levels of the state instruments of powers to the grassroots (Zanzibar Gender Policy, 2016).

# D.5.1.1 Gender Based Violence Against Women and Children

Violence against women and children is a grave violation of human rights. Its impact ranges from immediate to long-term multiple physical, sexual and mental consequences for women and children, including death.

In 2019 **Table D.5.1** shows that, type of violence reported in Zanzibar among all offences rape seemed to be the biggest problem in all districts compared to other offences. Magharibi 'A' reported to have large number of offences about 285 out of 1,369 total offences.

Magharibi 'B' and Mjini districts reported that more women have been sexually violence. In addition reported that more girls in Magharibi 'A' and Magharibi 'B' about 181 and 132 respectively than other districts (Table D.5.2.)

# **D.5.2** Gender in Leadership



Gender does not play a role in making someone a good leader but its capability and not Gender Determines Leadership

Gender Differences in Leadership

Table D.5.8 shows that, with the exception of primary court magistrate, where more women (55.5 percent) hold leadership positions, but its shown percentage of women decreased in this position by 13. 6 percent compared to previous year (69.2 percent) all other leadership positions are dominated by men except position of Chief Government Statistician. It is further observed that there are completely no women as Regional Commissioners (RC).

## E. LABOUR STATISTICS

Office of the Chief Government Statistician collects data on labour characteristics mainly from Formal Sector Employment and Earnings Survey (FSEES) and the Integrated Labour Force Survey (ILFS). FSEES is an annual establishment based survey, usually undertaken in the month of June to all Government, Parastatals and registered Private Institutions. The main objective of the FSEES is to provide information on employment and earnings to be used for planning, policy formulation and decision making processes. Collected information on number of employees refers to the month of June only, while cash earnings coveres the whole financial year (July – June).

ILFS is household based survey undertaken after every five years. The survey runs for the whole year, partly to take care of seasonality effect on employment. ILFS encompasser four survey modules: Labour Force General, Informal Sector, Time Use and Child Labour.

# **E.2** Employment and Earnings

Total employment for all sectors (i.e. Government, Parastatals and Private) increased by 6.3 percent to 62,804 in 2018/2019 compared with 59,079 in 2017/2018. The total wage bill in 2018/2019 was TZS 538,277 million, of which TZS 405,766 million of total wage bill was used for payment of salaries and TZS 20,751 millions for free ration (Table E.2.1).

For the year 2018/2019, employement of Government sector was 32,315, of which female employees (17,753) exceeded male employees (14,562). Education (8,663), Human heath and Social works (3,023) and Art, entertainment and recreation (102) industries had the highest number of female employees (Table E.2.2).

The wage bill for the Government sector in 2018/2019 used for salary payments was TZS 210,966 millions while TZS 1,159 million were payments for free ration. Education services alone spent TZS 90,241 million as wage bill for salary.

In 2018/2019 Parastatals employed 6,480 persons, of whom 4,395 were males. Transportation and storage industry had the highest number of employees (1,982) compared with other industries (Table E.2.3).

The Parastatal's wage bill for 2018/2019 stood at TZS 89,289 million, of which TZS 59,593 million were employees' salaries, TZS 2,112 million were payments in kind and TZS 27,584 million were cash payments given to employees as other benefits. Finance and Insurance industry had for the highest composition to total wage bill of TZS 19,503 million.

The Private Sector in 2018/2019 accounted for 24,009 employees, of whom 16,031 were males. Accommodation and food services industry had the highest number of employees (12,387)

(Table E.2.4).

The wage bill for all Private industries stood at TZS 182,228 million, of which TZS 135,207 millions were for salary payments, TZS 17,479 million for free rations and TZS 29,542 million as payments in-kind and other benefits paid to employees. Accommodation and food services industry alone shared TZS 102,149 million of the Parastatal's wage bill.

# F. MACRO ECONOMIC STATISTICS

### F.1 National Accounts

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is defined as the monetary value of all finished goods and services produced within an economic territory in a specific period of time (usually one year). It is the most important indicator in the System of National Accounts (SNA) used to gauge the health of a country's economy. The Production, Expenditure and Income methods are the approaches to its measurements; results of which are presented in current (years) or constant (base year or real) prices. The Office of the Chief Government Statistician has adopted the Production approach to the compilation of Zanzibar's GDP estimates.

For the year 2019, GDP at current prices stood at TZS 4,132.0 billion, interpreting the per capita income of TZS 2,549,000. At constant 2015 prices, the GDP increased to TZS 3,077.7 billion compared with TZS 2,875.5 billion observed in the previous year. This indicates that Zanzibar economy for the year 2019 grew by 7.0 percent (Table F.1.1).

The observed growth in the economy was a result of enhanced tourism industry and the general improvements in service industries: the number of tourists increased to 538,264 in 2019 compared with 520,809 in 2018; which also increased production shares in accommodation and food services (from 19.4 in 2018 to 20.2 percent in 2019); and the service sector also showed a significant growth of 8.7 percent (Table F.1.5).




Figure F.1.2: GDP Percentage Shares by Sector, 2019

## **F.2** Government Finance Statistics

#### Introduction

The Government Finance Statistics (GFS) also known as fiscal data which are generally referred to macroeconomic data that support the public finance economics. It reflects the Government's expenditure by its functions (CoFoG) and its transactions flows for economic activities including revenue, expenditure, changes in assets and liabilities and public net worth.

#### **Financial Resources**

During the financial year 2018/19, total resources of TZS 1,115.8 billion have been received which indicates an increase of 22.8 percent compared to TZS 908.8 billion in the previous year. This includes the domestic revenue of TZS 749.8 billion which is equivalent to 67.2 percent of total collections and shows an increase of 8.9 percent compared to TZS 688.6 billion in 2017/18. The tax revenues contributed 89.6 percent of domestic revenue, which is a slight decrease by 1.1 percentage share of its contribution to domestic revenue compared to 90.7 percent in the previous year. Of the external resources, TZS 43.5 billion was received as funding for development projects and TZS 322.5 billion was domestic and external loans (**Table F.2.1**).

### **Expenditures**

The overall Government expenditure in 2018/19 reached TZS 1,130.8 billion showing an increase of 25.7 percent compared with TZS 899.6 billion spent in 2017/18. A total of TZS 704.5 billion (62.3 percent) was allocated to meet recurrent expenditure. Development expenditure from domestic revenue of TZS 102.4 billion was spent during the year and TZS 323.9 billion from external resources was allocated to meet the development expenditure (**Table F.2.3**).

# F.3 Zanzibar Consumer Price Index (ZCPI)

Zanzibar Consumer Price Index is a measure of the average change in prices paid by consumers for a fixed market basket of goods and services. It is not a cost of living index but a proxy indicator to it. Information on retail prices is collected monthly on all items in the market basket. The basket has been obtained from the 2014/15 Zanzibar Household Budget Survey (ZHBS) and it uses the Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP) group specification.

The market basket has 343 items classified into food and non-food groups. According to ZHBS, 42.7 percent of non-institutional household consumption was on food consumed at home while the rest (57.3 percent) was the weight for non-food items. The main non-food items in the market basket were energy, fuel and utilities (18.4 percent), transport (9.6 percent) and clothing (6.9 percent). A total of twelve main groups and their respective weights have been classified for ease of computation of the index. Computation of the index is on monthly basis. The revised ZCPI uses the month of January, 2017 as its base (i.e. Base January 2017 = 100).

The ZCPI (an all items index) for the year 2019 was recorded as 110.3 compared with the average of 107.3 for the base year. The index for non food stood at 111.9 showing relatively rapid price movements compared to food index which recorded 108.1. An all items index is simply the weighted average of the group indices (**Table F.3.2**).

The change in price levels paid by consumers for the year 2019 stands at 2.7 percent, then reffered to as inflation. Similar indices for food and non-food are 2.8 and 2.6 percent, respectively. In 2018 the average inflation rate was 3.9, with food inflation rate of 1.4 and non-food inflation of 5.7 percent. The trend of the overall inflation rate in Zanzibar for the last six years remained in a single digit (**Table F.3.3**).




Fig F.3.1: **Annual Inflation Rate, 2010-2019**

## G. PRODUCTION STATISTICS

# **G.1** Agriculture Statistics

Agricultural production encompasses both, food and cash crops; varieties of crops, fruits, vegetables and spices are planted mainly for subsistence farming and a few in access are for the market. The products in agriculture also include animal husbandry (cattle, goats and chicken), fishing and forestry, while cloves and sea-weed are the main cash crops. Statistics on areas used to cultivate various food crops, fruits and vegetable production, volumes and values of animals inspected and slaughtered, fish catches and forestry products are collected from respective departments responsible with agriculture. Statistics on mining such as sand, stone, gravel, rubbles and limestone are collected from department of Forestry and Non-renewable Natural Resources within the Ministry of Agriculture, Natural resources, Livestock and Fisheries. Statistics on Cloves and stem cloves are collected from Zanzibar State Trade Company (ZSTC), while statistics on Sea weed production although it's operated under Private Companies but the statistics are collected by Ministry of Agriculture, Natural resources, Livestock and Fisheries.

# **Crop Production**

Agriculture sector is important economic sector of the Zanzibar's economy in terms of food production, employment generation, production of raw material for industries and generation of foreign exchange. The sector contributes about **21.2** percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Smallholders grew a wide variety of food and cash crops as well as fruits, vegetables and spices. Having a limited land for keeping livestock, there are few livestock kept on the islands. The most common livestock types raised in Zanzibar are cattle, goats and chicken.

# **Food Crops production**

For the year 2019, a total area of 97,576.3 acres was used to plant various food crops and vegetable production. From the total area used for crop production only 10.2 percent (10,000.9 acre) was used to plant fruits and vegetables. Whilst, 89.8 percent (87,575.4 acre) of the total planted area was used to plant food crops. This resulted to a total area planted with food crops increased from 82,506.9 acre recorded in 2018 to 87,575 recorded in 2019, equivalent to an increase of 6.1 percent. Total food crops, fruits and vegetable production in the country increased

from 375,837.2 tons recorded in 2018 to 404,285 tons in 2019, presents an increase of 7.6 percent. (**Tables G.1.2, G.1.3 and G.1.4**).

## **Cash Crops Production**

The quantity of cloves produced in 2019 showed an increase for more than 100 percent as compared with the previous year. The quantity purchased increased from 675.2 ton recorded in 2018 to 1,691 tons recorded in 2019 value at of TZS 23,647.2 million (**Table G.1.6**).

However, the production of seaweed decreased by 7 percent, from 10,424.9 tons in 2018 to 9,663.2 tons in 2019. The value of sea-weed purchased in 2019 was TZS 5,667.7 million. Quantities of cloves and consequently clove stems has been fluctuating over years, reflecting to seasonality in production of the crop, while that of sea-weed has been continuously decreasing since 2015 (**Table G.1.8**).




Figure G.1.1: Purchase of Cloves, 2015 - 2019

#### **Forest Resource**

The forest and woody resources play an important role in the daily livelihood of the people of Zanzibar. They are very important sources of energy for cooking, building timber, tourism, fodder, water catchments, shelters for wildlife and estuaries for fish breeding areas. Due to ever increasing demands of forest products in Zanzibar, the forest resources are facing severe exploitation pressure. Well managed forest resources can effectively contribute towards sustainable social and economic development of Zanzibar, at the same time maintaining its environmental integrity.

The native forest area in Zanzibar is 86,182 ha; 71,068 ha in Unguja and 15,114 ha in Pemba. Intermediate coral rag vegetation is the biggest Land Use and Land Cover (LULC) class in Unguja with 35,057 ha and 22.1 percent share of the land area and in Pemba the mixture of trees and agricultural crops LULC class is largest with an area of 22,482 ha and 22.2 percent of the land area (Zanzibar Woody Biomass Survey, 2013).

Data on forest resources are collected from licensed timber cutting from Government Forest Plantations and public land. In addition the Islands are surrounded by mangrove and other beach trees used in house and fishing boats construction. The Department of forestry and Non renewable Resources is concerned with the management of forest resources in the country.

#### **Quantity of Forest Products**

**Table G.1.14** shows that the volume of wood harvested for the year 2019 decreased; mainly motivated by the decrease in production of Beam production which decreased from 2,244.1 m<sup>3</sup> in 2018 to 1,721.1 m<sup>3</sup> presenting decrease of 23.3 percent. Building poles production also has decreased by 29.8 percent (3,115.1 m<sup>3</sup>); Medium poles production decreased by 12.3 percent from 3,182 in 2018 to 2,790 m<sup>3</sup> in 2019. Similar trend has been observed for Withes production and Charcoal of which decreased by 7 and 6.1 percents respectively compared with previous year. Contrary, the production of fire wood in the year 2019 increased from 26,569 m<sup>3</sup> recorded in 2018 to 32,189 m<sup>3</sup> recorded in 2019, equivalent to an increase of 21.2 percents.

#### **Mining G.2**

Data on mining products show that stone harvest for the year 2019 decreased by 22 percent (103,513 tons) compared with its harvest recorded in 2018. Sand harvest also decreased by 33 percent i.e. from 948,329 tons 2018 to 639,602 tons. Similar trend had been observed for the harvest of gravels, rubbles and limestone production which decreased by 21, six (6) and 29 percents respectively compared with the harvest and production recorded in 2018 (Table G.2.1).

# **G.3** Manufacturing Industry

Zanzibar industrial activities are centered mainly on small and medium scale processing of domestic goods; food processing, beverages and processing of agricultural products. Industrial sector includes all establishments engaged in activities that fall under mining (for Zanzibar this is mainly quarrying), manufacturing, generation and distribution of electricity, gas and water. This is as recommended in International Recommendations on Industrial Statistics.

#### **Selected Commodities**

This include only the commodities that was selected to present industrial production in Zanzibar, the commodities selected were those which shows the high output during the census of industrial production.

The production of the selected commodities increased by 19.7 percent in 2019. This was attributed to the increase in the production of sugar, beverage, wheat flour and noodles.

Production of beverage increased from 20,166 thousands liters in 2018 to 22,031 thousands liters in 2019 which is equivalent to 8.5 percent, the increase is due to the establishment of other factory.

Production of wheat flower increased from 26,963 tones in 2018 to 30,230 tones in 2019 which is equivalent to 12 percent mainly due to the increase in market demand. Noodles production increased from 295,701 kg in 2018 to 373,053 kg in 2019 (20.7 percent), this was due to its high market demand and it is a seasonal product.

Production of garments (Dash Dash) has decreased from 2,973 pcs in 2018 to 2,971 pcs in 2019 which is equivalent to 0.01 percent (Table G.3.1).

The production in public industries (clove stem oil, printing services and electricity distribution) has increased from TZS 87,958 Millions in 2018 to TZS 95,333 Millions in 2019 (8.4 percent). Private industries (beverages, wheat flour, diary product and garments) in 2019 have the lower value of production (TZS 67,697 Millions) than public industries (Table G.3.2).

#### **G.5** Investment

The Government of Zanzibar through ZIPA continues to create conducive investment environment to attract new investments, retaining the existing investments and promote small and medium enterprises (SME).

In 2019, 39 projects worth US \$ 395,566 Thousands were registered compared with 31 projects registered in 2018 (Table G.5.1 and G.5.3). In the same year, 4,859 people were expected to be employed compared to 1,001 peoples in the last year (Table G.5.2).

### H. TRADE, TOURISM AND TRANSPORT

### H.1 External and Inter - State Trade

Trade statistics gives brief explanation of flows/directions of trade, balances and volumes, specializations (comparative advantage) and their economic influence.

External trade statistics are compiled from documents provided by exporters and importers to the Tanzania Revenue Authority. It should also be noted that goods crossing international borders without appropriate Customs documentation are not included in external trade.

Exports statistics includes domestic export and re-export. Domestic export refers to exports of goods of national origin while re-export refers to goods exported either in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

Trade balance is the difference in the value of exports and imports. Zanzibar has never experienced a positive balance of trade; this means that Zanzibar always imports more than it exports.

Inter-State trade statistics provides an idea about the demand of commodities produced or consumed in Zanzibar along with the flows thereof to the other side of country that is Tanzania Mainland.

#### **Findings**

In 2019, Zanzibar recorded a total volume of trade worth TZS 803,884.6 million that marks an increase of 1.8 percent compared with TZS 818,309.8 million recorded in 2018 (Table H.1.1).

The recorded export values in 2019 was TZS 48,573.3 million which is lower by 16.5 percent compared with TZS 58,187.0 million recorded in 2018 (Table H.1.2).

The value of the imports in 2019 was TZS 755,311.3 million that indicates an increase of

0.6 percent compared with 760,122.8 recorded in 2018 (Table H.1.6).

The trade balance in 2019 has shown a deficit of TZS 706,738.1 millions compared with the balance of TZS 701,935.8 million recorded in 2018 (Table H.1.1).

Vegetable products contributed to TZS 33,095.5 million equivalent to 68.1 percent of the total export value in 2019 (Table H.1.2).

The exported value of Cloves recorded in 2019 was TZS 19,844.6 million which is equivalent to 40.9 percent of the total export. For the year 2019, India appeared to be the major buyer of the exported cloves from Zanzibar (Table H.1.3).

U.A.E recorded the highest value of import in 2019 worth TZS 381,130.9 millions, followed by China which recorded TZS 75,913.3 million. Mineral product recorded the highest value for imports (TZS 359,656.3 millions) in 2019 (Table H.1.9).

The import of fuel products has been increasing over time. In 2019 import of petrol fuel increased by 4.4 percent equivalent to 77,733,376 liters compared with 74,301,072 liters (Table H.1.8).

#### H.2 Tourism

This section consists of information of tourist arrivals into Zanzibar through major entry points, visitors by nationality, sex composition of visitors and their purpose of visit for international tourists.

Findings from Figure H.2.1 show that August recorded the highest number of visitors (68,163), followed by December (60,685) while May had the least number of visitors (15,640).

In country wise, Italy continued to dominate the tourism market in Zanzibar by accounting 11.4 percent of all visitors in 2019 and posted a growth of 9.8 percent compared with 2018, followed by America (8.1 percent) and Germany (7.9 percent) while New Zealand continued to be the least (0.2 percent) (Table H.2.1).

A total of 474,345 visitors (88.1 percent) visited Zanzibar through Airport, of whom 324,623 came by international flights and 149,722 by domestic flights from various regions of Tanzania Mainland. The remaining visitors 63,919 (11.9 percent) entered through Seaport whereby 758 visitor arrivals were day visitors (excursionist) and 63,161 visitors came by ferry from Tanzania Mainland (Table.H.2.2).

Composition by sex suggests more females visited Zanzibar than males. There were 244,692 (45.5 percent) males and 293,572 (54.5 percent) females who entered Zanzibar in 2019. Males decreased by 2.0 percent and females increased by 8.3 percent compared with 2018 (Table H.2.3).

The ages of the visitors were categorized into three broad groups: those younger than 15 years, 15 to 64 years, and 65 years and older. The overall results show that 33,625 (6.2 percent) visitors were aged less than 15 years; 471,561 (87.6 percent) were aged 15 to 64 years and 33,078 (6.1 percent) were aged 65 years and older. Majority of visitors (97.6 percent) came to Zanzibar for leisure/holidays (Table H.2.4 &Table H.2.5).

The number of visitors from emerging markets for the year 2019 decreased by 16.1 percent. Generally, the data show that majority of the emerging countries prevailed decrease of visitors in 2019 except Polish that increased by 24.7 compared with 2018 (Table H.2.6).

The data from Table H.2.7 shows that the peak season is usually observed in either August or December for the previous ten years, except for the year 2014 and 2016 whereby the peak was observed in February and October respectively.

Table H.2.8 and Figure H.2.2 show that, 2019 recorded the highest number of visitor arrivals that have never been recorded before. The number of visitors increased by 3.4 percent to 538,264 in 2019 from 520,809 visitors recorded in 2018. The remarkable increase of the visitors in 2014 was caused by the increase of the data collection coverage. Previously, the record was only for the visitors who directly entered Zanzibar and excluded those came from Tanzania Mainland.

The number of Hotels/Guest Houses increased from 509 in 2018 to 608 in 2019. There were 226 registered Hotels and Guest Houses in Kusini district recorded in 2019 followed by Kaskazini A (152 Houses/Guest Houses) while Wete district recorded the least (2 Houses/Guest Houses) as shown in Table H.2.9 and Table H.2.10.

The data from Table H.2.11 show that 68 Hotels/Guest Houses registered in 2019, with total of 778 rooms and 1,091 beds.




Figure H.2.1: Number of International Visitors Arrival by Month, 2019




Figure H.2.2: The Growth Rate of International Visitors, 2010 – 2019

## H.3 Utility, Energy and Fuel

The section presents statistics on water supply, electricity distributed and imports of fuel products. Data on water supply are collected on annual basis while electricity distributions are collected on quarterly basis

### **Water Supply**

The amount of water Supplied in 2019 was 56,447,478 cubic meters whereas the estimated demand was 83,295,998 cubic meters, this indicate a total deficit of 32.2 percent in demand. The highest water supply by region was recorded in Mjini Magharibi Region where 23,980,186 cubic meters were supplied followed by Kusini Pemba Region with 10,738,356 cubic meters. The region with the lowest water supply was Kusini Unguja whereby there were only 6,797,456 cubic meters supplied (Table H.3.1).

The total revenue collected for water supply in 2019 was TZS 4,412 millions with the highest revenue collected from Mjini Magharibi Region amounting TZS 1,525 millions (34.6 percent) followed by Kaskazini Unguja with total revenue of TZS1,052 millions (23.8 percent). The Region with the lowest revenue collected was Kaskazini Pemba with the total amount of TZS 321 millions (7.3 percent).

The number of Boreholes drilled in 2019 was 6 equivalents to number of boreholes drilled in 2018 (Table H.3.2).

### **Electricity**

The recorded number of new customers connected to National Power Grid in 2019 is 17,275 customers which is higher than 14,940 customers in 2018 (Table H.3.9).

The quantity of electricity sold to different customers increased from 354,845 thousand KWH in 2018 to 422,100 thousand KWH in 2019, and the value collected increased from 110,703 TZS thousands in 2018 to 120,852 TZS thousands in 2019 (Table H.3.11).

# **H.4** Transport and Communications

This section presents statistics on transport and communication activities. Transport stastistics comprise of data on road network, movements/trips (enter/exit), traffic handling of passengers and cargo – both at airports and seaports as well as information on number of motor vehicles registration and licenses issued to both public and private automobiles. Communication data comprise of number of registered radio and television.

#### **Transport**

The transport sector plays a big socio-economic role in the movements of people and distribution of goods and services. The transport system in Zanzibar is divided into:

- a. Interregional transport between Islands, Mainland and the coastal area of Eastern Africa.
- b. Local internal transport within islands.
- c. Transport to the rest of the world

The modes of transport comprises of sea, air and road transport. Interregional transport is handled by sea and air while local transport is dominated by road traffic and ferry boats. The Coastal Travel, Precision Air, Zan Air, Fast Jet, Tropical Air, Air Tanzania, Assalam, Auric Air, Flight Link etc. are the airlines that serve flights in and out of Zanzibar.

Shipping statistics relate to steam and sailing ships engaged in international or coastwise trade arriving either with cargo, passengers or in ballast. The cargo handled is shown in dead weight tones (d.w.t).

Number of passengers at Zanzibar Airports (Unguja and Pemba) increased from 1,350 thousands in 2018 to 1,419 thousands in 2019 (5.1 percent). Total Number of movements decreased to 65,647 in 2019 from 66,044 in 2018 (less than one percent).
